# AIR CRASH AT SEYMOUR MILITARY CAMP

FEBRUARY 26, 1931

On February 26, 1931 a double wing Westland Wapiti plane was carrying out dive bombing practice at the Seymour Military Camp, now known as the Light Horse Park. The plane had flown up from Laverton piloted by Hiram Scoullar and assisted by mechanic John Yourn. They had made several passes diving towards a gun emplacement on the ground when on the last dive, a wing hit a tree and the plane crashed. The two men were killed. Recently the exact spot where the crash occurred was established. Metal detectors were used to find the spot where bits of burned aluminium were located in the ground.

Through research, it was discovered that one of the daughters of the mechanic John Yourn was living in Melbourne. She was very surprised to find out that her father died at Seymour. She had always been under the impression that the plane had crashed at Laverton. Her name is Mary Eugene. She and her family have visited the site and have given a sizeable donation towards a plague to place on a boulder to commemorate the event that changed their lives. Ironstone rocks for the memorial have been located and installed, and the RAAF is sending an honour guard and padre to conduct a suitable ceremony in memory of the airmen. Guest speaker will be the distinguished WWII airman, Peter Isaacson, AM, DFC, AFC, DFM.

Also in attendance will be Brigadier Mark Holmes, MVO, Commander LWDC, Puckapunyal, SQNLDR Mike Dance of RAAF Williams, and Member for Seymour, Cindy McLeish. The event is set for Friday 13th May at 2.00PM. Interested people are very welcome.



# CHAMOMILE, German (Matricaria recutita)

Sometimes known as blue chamomile, it is a fragrant, low annual herb growing up to 0.6m tall with a delicate feather style leaf and daisy like white flowers on a single stem. It is native to central and northern Europe with Hungary being the main producers of the oil. German chamomile oil is steamed distilled from the dried flower heads with the essential oil content being the highest quality at the beginning of flowering and after drying of the flowers at 40- 45 degrees.

Since antiquity chamomile flowers have been used for digestive disorders and skin irritations such as eczema and urticaria and mucous membrane irritations. It is a local vasoconstrictor and can reduce the redness of cheeks due to enlarged capillaries and is excellent in relaxing the nerves, relieving spasms and easing pain, especially arthritis. bursitis and sprains. It is beneficial in treating nervous tension, insomnia, indigestion and headaches, and also contains liver regenerating properties and is considered one of the most gentle essential oils and so is beneficial in treating teething and colic in infants.

#### **FOX SIGNS**

The number of visible foxes often does not reflect the true number of foxes present in the landscape. Research carried out in the Bendigo area suggests that for every fox seen there will be another four undetected. The ratio of foxes seen to those undetected will vary according to topography, hunting pressure, and terrain.

Look for fox tracks on roads or sheep pads, and droppings near carcasses or scent marking posts. These will all be easily noticed if foxes are plentiful. The following examples of fox tracks have been reproduced from Triggs (1996).

Front foot track Hind foot track The heel pad of the front foot is separated from the toe by hair. This distinguishes the tracks from those of dogs.
