Boyd Dainton's family has been in the Goulburn Valley since the mid 1800s. Schooled in Shepparton, Boyd served time in the Royal Australian Navy as a National Serviceman before embarking on a career in electronics.

He grew his business around the well known AKAI brand and he became familiar with the challenges of successfully importing high tech products from Asia. After selling his business to Chinese interests, Boyd chose to retire to Strathbogie where he set about building his own home from environmentally responsible materials including an off-grid power system. It was during this process that he became fascinated with the largely untapped potential for solar powered pumps, fences and lighting in the Australian agricultural and leisure industries.

Boyd had previously obtained the rights to the business name 'Commodore' from the makers of the early Commodore 64 Computers and he set up his company, Commodore Australia in its current location on the Old Hume Hwy, Euroa.



The demand for Boyd's solar products & solutions is strong and he says that the busiest areas of his business are off-grid solar system upgrades, solar powered submersible pumps and solar electric fences. 

The idea of opening the front gate to visitors may seem crazy to many landholders but not to Samantha Chaffey and Eric Lemoussu of Gippsland who are earning another farm income from offering authentic camping sites. Their motivation is to have a diversified farm income so the health of their land isn't compromised.

They are proud of their property and the good condition it is in.

Public camping grounds are restrictive and often full and not all travellers want to stay in van park camping suburbia or highway rest areas.

Also, travellers want authentic experiences off the well-trodden tourist track.

Farmers and landholders are looking for new income streams that contribute to a property being managed sustainably. *Youcamp.com* meets both these needs.

Almost every property has a spot that travellers would like to visit – a river or creek frontage, a private fishing spot, a beautiful dam or even just a big shady tree that would be perfect to park a fully self-contained campervan under.

Youcamp.com has recently listed a number of Victorian properties where the owners have been stunned at the interest from the public.

Shortly before Christmas Samantha and Eric decided they would open their front gate and share their land with carefully chosen, responsible members of the public who wanted a more authentic camping experience.
