READERS' WRITES

"When I heard there might be a music festival in the district which would double as a community fund-raiser, I thought, "What a great idea."
When I heard there would be 3,500 festival-goers, I thought, "That's a lot for our roads to cope with."
When I heard that it was to be held in late November, I thought, "What about the fire risk?"

People started to google Strawberry Fields and a new picture of this "music and camping" festival emerged. Held near Tocumwal for the past three years, the picture is one of drug and alcohol-effected drivers, arrests for drug possession and trafficking, farreaching music noise, considerable litter and bad debts.

I read the planning application.
Music will play almost continuously
from 4pm Friday to 9pm Sunday. At
least 1000 cars (not counting set-up/
take-down crew trucks) are expected
to travel along the School Bus Route.
In the event of fire, they "have a plan".
I read the plan; it did not allay my
concerns.

I (and others) wrote letters of objection to the Murrindindi Shire Council. I (and others, including the Yea Police) spoke against the granting of a permit at the council's Open Forum on October 8th. Of the four people who spoke in favour, two were employees of Strawberry Fields, neither of whom had previously worked on this event. The council voted 4-1 in favour of granting a permit for the festival, to be held at 609 Gum Rd, Caveat, on November 21st-24th.

This festival is inappropriate for a small, rural community. It presents serious safety concerns and constitutes a major imposition on local residents. The negative aspects far outweigh any imagined benefits."
