Well as term 4 and spring start to make an appearance 'Down Under' this will be the last TGN from the land of the beaver, moose and caribou - & what magnificent animals they all are. Having visited several Canadian National Parks they are most impressive. However it's not only the fauna and spectacular views that stand out, but the conservation & community engagement aspects as well. Here are some points, listed at Fundy NP, that you might like to consider. I have adapted them for our local areas. Common is suddenly not so common.....

Can you imagine your garden without magpies? The bush without koalas or Australia without kangaroos? It is important to remember that at one time, many species that are now at risk of disappearing from the planet were just as common. In fact 30,000 species globally are becoming extinct each year. It's up to all of us to make sure that we provide natural areas for all living things to live and thrive for generations to come.

- * One important thing you can do is educate yourself about the ecosystem in your own "backyard". What kind of plants and animals do you see in your community. What trees and other plants are part of the natural ecosystem.
- * Find out what species are at risk in your neighbourhood. There may be simple things you can do to assist with their recovery, like leaving areas wild to provide habitat.
- * You can assist in your community by using you powers of observation. Maybe participate in a yearly population counts of various species? (NB the annual backyard bird count is coming up at the end of October, see p.3 for further details.)

 There you go, for the last time, Pauline And Kenny? was having fun rogaining.

Rambling around Highlands

On a beautiful day made for walking, the Ramblers set out from the Switzerland Ranges Conservation Reserve and climbed

Mt Broughton to be greeted by sensational views across the Goulburn Valley. Then it was back to the cars for lunch in the sun and on to Kate's Hill where the magical Pinniger Cairn was finally rediscovered in its bush setting (see photo). This intact stone structure, made from local hornfels, would have to be close to the earliest man made structure still existing in Highlands. It was constructed in the 1860s as part of

the Geodetic Survey of Victoria, with



the aim of providing a sound framework for local surveys and subsequent land subdivision. Only a few of these cairns survive in the area. A very enjoyable, relaxing day.

Backyard Bird count is on again!

Dust of your binoculars and get your pen ready, the Aussie Backyard Bird Count is on again from October 22 to 28, 2018. For the last four years local residents have been participating in Bird Life Australia's 'Backyard Bird Count' which uses 'citizen science' to track bird numbers and species around Australia. The Backyard Bird Count is a fun way for everyone to become more aware of the birds we share our environment with. All you



have to do is go outside for 20 minutes and count how many birds you see and what type they are. It doesn't matter if you're a novice or an expert – you can just 'look up' those you don't know on the free 'Aussie Bird Count' app or at www.aussiebirdcount.org.au. Then you just upload your findings to the website or through the app. You can undertake as many or as few observation sessions as you want over the designated week in late October. Last year, more than 72,000 people around Australia participated in the Bird Count, submitting some 60,000 checklists which tallied almost two million birds. Not surprisingly the most commonly detected bird species in our local area was the Sulphurcrested Cockatoo, closely followed by the Australian Magpie and Crimson Rosella. Results from 2017 also showed a decline in Kookaburra numbers and an unfortunate increase in aggressive species, including the Noisy Miner. However the presence of four near-threatened bird species were also recorded – the Black-eared Cuckoo, Diamond Firetail, Azure Kingfisher and Pied Cormorant. Why not get involved in 2018?

Hollows as wildlife habitat

Many species of wildlife rely on natural tree hollows for nesting, breeding and shelter. Hollows provide a safe home away from the weather and predators. In eucalypt trees, small hollows may take over 70 years to develop and large hollows many decades longer. The range of hollow sizes and types is matched by the range of wildlife able to use them – small species such as the Feathertail Glider use small hollows, large parrots such as the Sulphur-crested Cockatoo use large, deep hollows. Not all natural hollows are occupied. This can be because the hollow is unsuitable. It can



also be because, when not breeding, most species will move frequently between a number of hollows. **NB: Hollows & Nesting Box Habitat articles will be featured when space permits, enjoy. Ed**


