

Doug Lade contributes his first day at Highlands State School No 3440

In February 1926, aged 4 years and 11 months, I saddled "Old Pony", and with my father leading him down the road, we met Annie Lade, aged 13, (Andrew Shaw's grandmother) on her pony. She attached a leading rein to Old Pony for the two and a quarter mile (3.6 kms) ride through Yorston's paddocks to the Highlands School at the cross roads. The ponies were then shut in the horse yard (where the tennis courts are now situated) for the day.

The school room was part of the Highlands Hall, and my first teacher was Miss May I.Rouse (the one and only staff). She boarded with my parents and walked to school. About 5 older children were in Grade 8, and 7 of us in Grades 1 to 7. I shared a desk with George Tennant, and we were issued with a slate and a pencil each. Arithmetic was the first lesson, then we cleaned our slates, or turned them over, ready for spelling and writing. The school lessons finished at 3.30, and I rode home for afternoon tea, before feeding horses, dogs and hens.

DISTRICT WEATHER Hot, humid days with afternoon and evening thunderstorms has been the pattern for the past week. RECOGNIZING ACUTE EMOTIONAL DISTRESS

As we know, the drought is a very stressful time for many people. Janet Hagen recently went to a seminar on "The drought and Stress" and sent me these notes. Many of the behaviours described are perfectly normal, every day responses to life and should only be considered to be of concern if they are out of character and combined with a number of other symptoms.

What might lead you to be concerned about an individual.

Behaviours :

Avoidance / Withdrawn behaviour Disorganized behaviour Deterioration in dress or appearance / reduced self care Erratic behaviour

Repetitive or seemingly compulsive behaviour Self - destructive or high risk behaviour

Aggressive behaviour Loss of interest in everyday activities.

Substance abuse . Drugs or alcohol.

Biological Changes:

Changes in appetite and weight.
Changes in energy and activity levels
Changes in sleeping patterns.
Decreased levels of Functioning:
Reduced family, interpersonal or social
functioning.

Mood Changes:

Frequent anger, irritability or tantrums. Increased levels of fear and anxiety. Reduced enjoyment and interest in usual activities.

Depressed behaviour including crying and despair.

Thoughts:

Confusion, Impaired judgement, Delusions, including fixed false beliefs about oneself, other people, events or the environment.

Difficulties comprehending language. Hallucinations . either auditory , visual or tactile.


