LIGHTWOOD -Acaciaimplexa,is summerflowering,andisasmalluprighttree,withverypaleyellowflowers,andcurvedsickle -shapedphyllodes,andalsohasastrongwood.lt isnotnearlyascommonasBlackwoodinourarea.
