## INTERVIEW WITH A

#### BITS of BOTANY and BIRDS

NODDING GREENHOOD ORCHID (Pterostylis nutans)

This is a good time to start looking for our native Greenhood Orchards. The leaves of the Nodding Greenhood are now appearing as a flat basal rosette, usually near trees in shaded areas. Each flower stem is 10cm + long and carries one nodding or drooping flower.

Rabbits and grazing stock will nip off the flowers as they appear, so I put a low fence of old netting, supported by wooden garden stakes, round any colonies I may find. There are several good colonies on our roadside (Lade Rd, Highlands). The flowers will appear in August. It is well worth protecting these patches, as they are becoming more and more rare.
