He started off in the air force as an aircraft maintenance engineer, then went on to the Northern territory and worked as a stock man on Brunette Downs. As her work is shift work, they have to juggle their lives to make sure they spend time together. As Grant seems to work seven days a week and is available 24 hours a day, this seems pretty important! They moved to the Weibye Track with Nat's son Lachlan. He is entering his second year as an apprentice carpenter and works for Great Bearlog Homes in Mansfield. He has just spent six weeks in New Zealand doing a log home building course which he loved.

Grant does a lot of work in the Terip area but is happy to travel further afield. He does anything! This includes fencing using a hydraulic post driver and pneumatic picket and pipe driver, pump repairs, arenas and round yards ,cattle and sheep yards, on site welding, general home, farm and factory maintenance, firewood using a splitting gun for large logs and an explosive blasting service to get rid of rabbit burrows, stumps and rocks.

Under the Education Tax Refund, families can claim up to 50 per cent back on a range of education expenses – up to \$397 for each primary school child and \$794 for each secondary school child.

Parents or guardians who receive Family Tax Benefit Part A for children in primary or secondary school are eligible for the refund, as well as those on other allowances such as the Disability Support Pension.

BERGAMOT (Citrus bergamia)

Bergamot is an upright tree that grows to 12m but under cultivation it is pruned to 4-5m in height. It bares fruit which is generally globoid to 7.5cm, the peel is thin and smooth but rather tough. The fruit is too sour to eat so the trees sole purpose is for the production of essential oil. It takes its name from the small town of Bergamo in Northern Italy where it was originally cultivated. An Italian family, the Feminis, in the 16th century, developed eau-de-cologne in which the essential ingredient is Bergamot. This stimulated the production of the oil. Bergamot oil is produced by cold expression from the peel of nearly ripe fruit. It has a fresh citrussy aroma but is phototoxic on the skin so care must be taken.

Bergamot's chemical composition is that of linalyl acetate. limonene and linalol and its primary uses are in the digestive, immune, nervous and urinary systems and also skin care. It is useful in relieving colic, flatulence and indigestion. It has been found to inhibit cold sores (herpes simplex), chicken pox and shingles especially when blended with 100% essential oils of Lavender and Tea Tree. Bergamots antidepressant property make it a wonderful oil for those who are tense, anxious or depressed. It is also recommended for the treatment of cystitis and urinary tract infections if used in the early stages i.e. 3 to 4 drops in a carrier oil added to a sitz bath as it may prevent the infection from spreading. Bergamot is an excellent oil in treating acne, skin infections and oily skin. It is an ingredient in metier foaming facial cleanser. A hot compress of Bergamot can be used on boils to draw out the infection.

ERADICATING EUROPEAN WASPS IS EVERYBODY'S RESPONSIBILITY

February to April are the months when European wasps are multiplying and Murrindindi Shire Council is encouraging people to take action to reduce numbers.

European wasps can be identified by their bright yellow and black bandings.

"We encourage people to contact Council if they think they have located a European wasp nest on Council property. Our officers will visit the site as soon as possible to destroy the nest."

An owner or occupier of property, who is aware that there is a wasp nest on the property, must take steps to remove it. Wasp nests are usually in the ground, but can occupy wall cavities, tree hollows, river banks and other confined spaces. There is no soil mound around the hole to indicate its presence as they carry the excavated soil from inside away so nest identification is usually during the day when wasp activity is at its peak and large numbers of wasps are leaving and re-entering the nest.

"Given the level of activity occurring during daylight hours, it is important that people avoid the treatment of nests until the evening. European wasps react to noise vibrations and are very aggressive and can deliver multiple and painful stings," Cr Abbott-Smith said.


