LOCALS SIGNING UP AS ORGAN DONORS

Federal Labor Member for McEwen Rob Mitchell MP today welcomed statistics that showed Victoria has the third highest number of registered organ donors of any state in Australia. Mr Mitchell an organ donor himself said almost 800,000 people living in Victoria over the age of 15 had registered their intention to be an organ and tissue donor with the Australian Organ Donor Register.

Mr. Mitchell said people can lodge or update their decision on the register by visiting www.donorregister.gov.au, a Medicare office, or calling 1800 777 203.

Around 1,7000 people remain on national transplant waiting lists at any one time.

BURNING OFF RULES

The CFA Fire Danger Period will end across Murrindindi Shire on Monday 7 March and Council has put in place an amnesty so people can get their properties cleaned up following the significant summer rains.

The amnesty period will commence 12 March and continue through to 28 March. After that time people will need a permit to burn in residential areas.

Landholders will still need a permit if they want to burn windrows.

Balancing Love & Discipline A Parenting Program

The program is run by Marc des Landes from Familycare in Seymour. Marc has conducted numerous parenting workshops and worked with adults and children in a counselling capacity. Marc is highly regarded and has a terrific reputation in this area. The course is open to all parents and has an emphasis on the important role of the father in establishing sound relationships with their children.

March is Murrindindi's ferals month

It is the legal responsibility for all landowner to eradicate foxes and rabbits on their properties.

Fox Baiting

As foxes are an extremely mobile pest and cover large areas in search of food, control programs are rarely effective if carried out in isolation. A group of farmers working together in a simultaneous and coordinated manner are far more likely to achieve a long term impact on fox numbers. Contact your Local Landcare group to become involved with a co-ordinated program.

The timing of poisoning programs may vary from one area to another, but it is generally considered beneficial to poison twice a year, once in autumn, this baiting is when cubs (inexperienced) are dispersing to find new territory and again in winter during the reproductive phase.

Poisoning foxes prior to lambing will significantly increase the percentage of lambs surviving and this benefit alone should encourage more landholders to participate in a program. While such a program may be primarily undertaken for economic reasons, the benefits for our native wildlife are also considerable.

The winter program targets the fox breeding season, reducing the number of breeding females and their potential for realised offspring. By poisoning twice a year, it is possible to achieve a long term reduction in fox numbers, as opposed to the autumn only approach, which is really only a means of reducing fox numbers in the short term to protect livestock .

BITS OF BOTANY AND BIRDS

Bluebells

Wahlenbergia

There are several species of native bluebells found locally, growing in clusters by roadsides and in the shade of the bush. The 5-petalled flowers bloom over summer and are from pale to bright blue or purple,. The plant is a herb with short thin leaves and a generally wispy appearance, generally up to .5 metre for most species but a bit higher for the tall bluebell (Wahlenbergia stricta).

IMPACTS OF VEGETATION AND LARGE WOOD ON FLOODING

This is an extract from a statement prepared by Alluvium for Wimmera CMA: Alluvium is a consultancy group that specializes in applying science-based, technical approaches to develop robust, practical solutions on catchment and water-related environmental issues. They provide expert advice to both government and corporate bodies throughout Australia.

'Recent work undertaken by hydrologist, Dr Brett Anderson, found that large wood and vegetation distributed throughout a stream system, from headwaters to the outlet, reduced flood peaks. Dr Brett Anderson found that the slight reductions in velocity of flow in stream systems associated with vegetation and large wood had a beneficial impact on downstream flood levels by slowing up the pace and size of a flood peak.

In contrast, past programs that sought to remove large wood and vegetation from stream systems would have a negligible impact on the depth and extent of major floods and if undertaken through the entire length of a stream system would increase flood occurrence in the downstream reaches.'
