Bald Hill Bushland Reserve -

Posted on May 17, 2011 by bertbohosouth Strathbogie Ranges - Nature View

On Sunday about 20 of us went for a walk through Bald Hill Bushland Reserve, which is a prominent peak on the eastern rim of the Strathbogie Tableland and to the east of Strathbogie township. The weather was cool and overcast, but we were spared an icy wind and rain.

Though the last month has been relatively dry, the bush was damp from some recent rain.

There were very few birds about, but plenty of plants, views and scrambling kept us all busy. Bald Hill is part of one of the high ridges that separates the catchment of the Sevens Creek, from the neighbouring catchment of the Brankeet Creek, that flows into Eildon, near Ancona. Rain that falls on the east side of the Bald Hill ridge mostly flows into Bridge Ck then into Eildon, whereas rain that falls on the west side flows into Bald Hill Ck, then the Sevens. Two very different routes into the Goulburn River.

The Reserve is public land zoned for conservation but is pretty much surrounded by private property. If you intend visiting, make sure you go on foot and get permission from adjacent landholders before crossing private property.

This Reserve is a special place that deserves our care and attention. It contains some high quality habitat and a range of plants and animals that have disappeared from much of the Strathbogie Tableland.



BOTANIC GUARDIANS

BUSH SCONES

This recipe was given to me by a drover in Outback S.A. They are called Bush Scones because they use oil – butter melts in the bush, and there is no need to wash up a messy bowl.

2 cups S.R.Flour, ¾ cup milk, ¼ cup oil I use Canola oil or Peanut oil – but an oil with a light viscosity – not olive and not sump. Pre-heat camp oven (or conventional oven to about 180c). Sift Flour into large bowl. Stir the liquids together (as they naturally separate) and pour into flour. Stir quickly (about 30 sec) until mixture cleans the sides of the bowl. Spread out the mix about an inch (or say 3 cm) and cut with a scone ring dunked in flour.

Place together on a tray and heat for 12 -15 min depending on your oven.
No need to grease oven tray!
My tip is to make an ever so slightly wetter mix and add a bit of flour, but not the other way. Cheers Philip Wischer

BOOK REVIEWS BY PAULINE ROBERTS

The Book Thief - Markus Zusak

If you're like me and want to enjoy a book from the very first page, then persevere past the first 16 pages of The Book Thief and you will be well rewarded. The narrator of this story, set in Nazi Germany, is Death and the first few pages appear to leap disjointedly from one vignette to another. This coupled with the *Little Announcements* throughout the text do take a bit of getting used to but it is worth it. Zusak's story paints a vivid description of life on a single street in an outlying suburb of Munich and the daily struggle for survival of its inhabitants. One of whom is the Book Thief. The story really commences with Liesel's arrival on Himmell St and the author's skill is such that by the end of the story the reader has become so immersed in the character's lives that they too feel the overwhelming loss that is inevitable in war.

At Risk - Stella Rimington

As the front cover declares "a stunning debut novel from the former head of MI5" and despite the hype it really is. With all the good attributes of a Le Carre or Forsyth novel it races along at breakneck speed as Liz Carlyle frantically works to discover who the ??? is and which target they are intending to take out in the cause of jihad. A tightly written, suspense-filled novel that no doubt owes a lot of its plot to the author's previous employment. If this read appeals there is a sequel already out Secret Asset and if you are intrigued by the real life adventures of Stella, rather than her alter ego, then her autobiography Open Secret is a must read.

Satin bowerbird

I recently saw a bird list from Strathbogie in 1902:

and was a bit surprised to see Satin Bowerbird listed - its normal habitat is damp forests. I have only ever seen any once at Caveat, and Peg Lade has seen them a couple of times in Highlands. The ones we saw weren't the glossy bright blue males that build the bowers and that most people would recognise. Males up to the age of 5 or 6 and females of any age are speckled green with brownish wings, and these are more likely than the mature males to wander into the drier bush during autumn and winter, returning in spring to the wetter forests where they breed.
