PEOPLE and PLACES.

TARCOMBE(originallyknownasthe "ValeofTempe")wasapastoralrun onHughesCreek,thefirstsquatter controllingabout40,000acresin 1841

Intheearlydaysthereweremany disputesaboutboundaries, one notable one being between Thomas Webster of Dropmore, and F.J. Bury of Tarcombe. Eventually, Surveyor's Creek (runs into Hughes Creek downstream of Dropmore), was agreed to be the boundary.

Intheearlydays,thedifficultaccess wasfromAvenel(viatheWickedHill) orfromLongwood,andtheproperty whichwasnowmuchsmaller, changedhandsmanytimes.Some nameswereBudd,Adams,Finley, Kong-Meng,andin1903Roderick Fergusonacquiredit.By1914drought andrabbitshadtakenoverandheleft. Oneownerinthe1930sand40s,aMr ParkerAdams,wasreputedtobea "goodrabbitman"andhegotthings moreundercontrol.

In1955, Gilbert Hayesbought the property from Lachie Little (Ronnie and Malcolm's father) and a MrLe Roux. It was then 2900 acres and 1100 acres was added when part of Habbies Howewas sold in 1980.

APostOfficewasestablishedatTar-combehomesteadin1887anditcontinueduntil1943.Somenamesof postmasterswereFinlay,McIntyre, Jaeger,JamesChisholm,MrsReynolds,Moore,Buick,Scott,Bunting,FrankTubbandEarl.Themailwas conveyedfromLongwoodbyhorse drawnvehicle,andinFrankTubb's daytherewere14gatestoopen.

ThenearestschoolwastheHughes Creek,orTarcombe,schoolatBungle Boori,whichopenedin1884,closed from1915to1925,andfinallyclosed forgoodin1943.

Thepresentowner, Gilbert'sson Robert, was 4 years old when he came to Tarcombe, and he says there were 7 gatestoget to Euroa, and 6 or 7 toget to Seymour. His early schooling was by correspondence, until a school bus started to the Ruffyschool. Robhated being sent to Hailey bury College in Melbourne as aboarder, for his secondary schooling, as healways wanted to run the property, and saw no sense in anything else!

In1972,RobmarriedJanBain,whose fatherworkedatHabbiesHowefor manyyears.Theybuiltasolidnew house,designedbyDavidUnderwood (thenofHighlands)withbeautifulgraniterockworkbyHowardMitchell.

JanandRobbroughtup2daughters (onenowavetandoneanAg.Scientist)andason,Tim,wholiveswithhis wife,Cindy,anddaughterBridie,at "Temagong",Terip,butworksatTarcombemostofthetime.

Gilbert(whodiedin1998)setupa verysuccessfulHerefordstudanda largeflockofmedium -woolMerinos, thesebeingconstantlyimprovedby Rob.Thisyear,forthefirsttime,there willbenoon -propertybullsale,and bullswillbesoldprivately.

RobandJanworkveryhardtomaintainandimproveaverybeautiful,but oftendifficultproperty. Theyhave plantedthousandsoftrees, are sometimes disheartened by failures, but intend to continue, and they get great pleasure from family encouragement and support. By PegLade

Rabbits with scabby faces


