ThiswasheldinHighlandsonthe1st Marchandattendedby20interested landownersfromallovertheHughes Creekcatchment.

Dr.PeterMitchellwasaveryinformativespeaker.Heexplainedthatthere areover1200differentspeciesofAustraliannativegrasses.Nativegrasses havepersistedwellonmostfarmsdue totheirpersistenceinacidandlow fertilitysoils,agreatertolerancetoa widerangeofsoiltexturetypes,and droughtandfrosttolerance.

Encouragingnativeperennialgrasses inexistingpastureswillhavethebene-fitsofimprovedgroundcoverandsoil stability,weedcompetitionwithhigh persistence,lowinputgrazingsystems,increasedwaterusetoreduce groundwaterrecharge,improvedsoil structureandorganicmatter,reduced soilacidificationrateandgreaterspeciesdiversity.

There's alot of Microlaen astipoides (Weeping Grass) around at present. It's green throughout they ear producing high quality feed. Have alook in your paddocks for it now.

# District News TARCOMBE Rabbits Extraordinary

(FromourSpecialReporter)

Threewellknowngentlemenfrom Longwood,hearingthatagoodday's rabbitshootingcouldbeobtainedat Tarcombe,determinedtohaveaday's pastime.

EarlyonGoodFridaymorningthey harnessedupafinepairoftrotting horses. Theywere well supplied with sportsmen's requisites, not forgetting tea, sugarandas prinkling offirewater.Thedaywascoolandbracing,no dustanywhere,thankstoafallofrain ontheprevious evening. The roadran southsometwelvemiles. For along distanceitwasacontinuousascent. Allthecountrywasofagraniticformation, largeboulders laystrewninall directions.Inmanyplacestheroad wasfilledwithroundstonesofconsiderablesize.thusrenderinadriving arduous.Wheretheroadskirtedsidlingsandmadesharpcrossingsthe difficultiesincreasedandmaderunninghazardousintheextreme.

Theteamdoubledthemselvesupand pulledlikestaunchploughhorses, occasionallyrequiringaresttoregain theirstrength..

Inwintertimethetrackbecomesa morassandonlylighttrapscanget through.Recentlyadraughthorsewas socompletelysubmergedthatitrequiredthestrengthoffivehorsesto extricatehim!

Afterfivemilesofsuchtravellingthe partypassedthroughthepropertyof KongMengandsons.Greatimprovementshavealreadybeeneffectedby theseenterprisingmen.Theyhave erectedsomefinefences,madeclearingsandgardensandbuiltacommodioushomestead.

Sofarnotarabbittobeseen. The countryisallhill, mountain and valley. The hills clothed with green trees; bracken and tree ferns are growing in the hollows. The country seemed well adapted to sheep grazing.

ThetravellerspassedthroughUpton, aplaceoflittlenotenowbutformerly ofimportanceasbeingtheheadquartersofasheepstation. Afterthisthe roadwendedalongbythesideofa finestream, atributary of the Hughes Creek.

Meetingoneofthehospitableowners of Tarcombe, information was obtained which pleased the party. They were told to trythe hillopposite the house and they would be satisfied.

Aftermakingabriefhaltforrefreshmentsthepartyopenedoutandmade forthehill.Inafewminutestheysaw morerabbitsthantheyhaddreamtof Rabbitstotherightofthem!Rabbitstothefrontof them!

Theydidn'tvolleyandthunderbutthe gunsdidwithawill.Rabbitsblack, white,piebald,greyandnondescript coollytrottedalong.Theydidnotdeign torun,buttookmattersleisurely,frequentlysittinguplistening.Therethey wereaveritablerabbitarmy,fully threethousandstrong.Theveriesttyro couldhaveshotthembythedozen.

Thepartyblazedawayasfastasthey couldload,therabbitstumbleddown theslopeintheirdeathsomersaults.

Onthewaybacksackfullsofrabbits were collected.

Strangetorelate, although grasswas scarceyettherabbits were insplended condition. The ground washard and rocky. The burrows were allover the hill but very shallow. The whole surface of the hill was scratched up and covered in the manuremade by the selittle animals.

Theguns, becoming choked with burnt powder became difficult to use. The travellers were well pleased with their surprising success, and after hitching up their team, go thometo Longwood in excellent time.

Mayorofthe Murrindindi Shire Council, CrLyn Guntersaid the grant would help the council address the local im-




