RUFFARTZ SEASONS OF SATURDAYS

Who am I?

Who is ten years old, has thirty heads, thirty legs, one hundred and twenty fingers, can be male or female and have the potential to inspire over a thousand people living in Victoria to laugh, clap, tap their feet, sing, dance and be happy? I am the RuffArtZ Season of Saturdays 2009 and boast fourteen exemplary talented musicians and a first class comedian. The RuffArtZ Season of Saturdays has been delivering a diverse range of quality entertainment to Ruffy Hall for over ten years. The subscription series program consists of four shows spread throughout the calendar year, each of which offers a special live experience that is shared in thirteen regional Victorian towns.

The program for 2009 starts with 'Carneval Strings' a dynamic, traditional string quartet who present a range of music from Baroque and Classical, seasoned with Latin American, lively 50's and 60's Swing Jazz style and European Folk Tunes. The essence and passion of Hungarian folk music becomes obvious as the two Hungarian violinists wander through the audience entertaining the listeners.

Another first is the inclusion of a one man comedy play to the series. "Last Drinks" is written and performed by Damian Callinan and directed by Matt Parkinson. The show debuted at last year's Melbourne International Comedy Festival.

The third show in the series maintains the Aussie feel. "Welcome Strangers" is a super group of four consummate musicians. Their show features tenderly collected versions of all but lost rural Australian fiddle tunes. Every song and tune in the repertoire also has a unique and interesting preamble and usually an accompanying yarn.

Past subscribers will be familiar with the fact that we like to end the year on a energetic high and the New Melbourne Jazz Band have got just the show to help us kick up our heels. This wonderfully uplifting six piece band plays swinging, foot tapping, great to dance to Dixieland Jazz.

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED TO HELP WITH BUSHFIRE RECOVERY

The Hughes Creek Catchment Collaborative is looking for any community members who are willing to help landholders in the Flowerdale and Glenburn areas with bushfire recovery work.

We are assisting with the recovery work on four properties, owned by members of our neighbouring Upper Goulburn Landcare Network, who have been badly burnt out in the recent fires. These people need our help to get their lives back on track. The scale of the clean up and rebuilding jobs are overwhelming for a farming family and we would like to offer them a hand.

Stage 1: Help is urgently needed now with removal of burnt boundary fencing, clearing of fence lines, recycling of fencing materials, restoration and repair of internal fences, stock yards, sheds, gate ways and watering systems

Stage 2: Later in the season: Erosion control, pasture restoration, garden restoration, tree plantation replacement, weed control, general moral support.


