Susan Fell Mclean

In. . . the Journey, an exhibition of works on paper and canvas, textiles and sculptures at the gallery at the Mitchelton Winery Euroa based artist Susan Fell Mclean integrates her passion for travelling with art. Her curiosity and adventurous spirit has led her into laneways of a medieval city in Italy, and a remote Iban village in the jungle of Borneo the Australian desert, France, USA and Malaysia. 2009 finds her hard at work in her home territory north eastern Victoria.

In every location, Susan Fell McLean's quest is for the experience that captures the spirit of the place, that she can then document in her photographs and paintings, or translate into her two and three dimensional textile pieces. 'I look for inspiration in the landscape, and amongst the people, in the daily details involved in living in a particular place; I find out as much as I can about the history. Something geographical, cultural, archaeological, or even the climate could become the inspiration to create a new piece. I set out with my camera and visual diary and search until each place yields something new or unexpected. For me, travel is about learning as well as seeing' she explains.

Finds, a series of three textile pieces stitched with silks from a small family owned haberdashery shop and coloured with locally prized wines and porchini (mushrooms) from Tuscany is one example of the way Susan captured the experience of spending time in an artist's studio Palzzo Vaj in Prato, Italy. STUART REID'S ACCIDENT

Following an accident on 20 April while cutting a branch from a tree on our property, Stuart was sent to Royal Melbourne Hospital Intensive Care Unit. He is now recovering in the Austin Hospital's Spinal Unit. Stuart's spinal cord has been damaged and he has 6 fractured ribs and a punctured lung. He did not lose consciousness throughout his ordeal and has not required an operation to stabilise his spine. When he is ready he will be transferred to Royal Talbot Rehabilitation Centre.

We don't yet know how long this process will take or how full his recovery will be, but he is very determined and is making progress each day. The right side of his body is most affected, but he is gradually regaining feeling and movement in all his limbs. He is already sitting up and has taken several steps with support.

I am staying in Heidelberg in a flat close to the hospital and our world has shrunk down to Ward 3 North and that is where I will also be for some time, although I will be back and forth to Highlands. We welcome visitors. You can phone me on 0407 843 624.

It has been wonderful to have the support of our children and grandchildren and so many friends over the past few days.

Recovery from the February bushfires will, in many cases, be dependent on people getting back to work as soon as possible. Two initiatives are being implemented to assist local businesses and individuals to be first in line when opportunities present themselves. "Council has been working with The Industry Capability Network (ICN) and the Rural Skills Connect (RSC) program to open the door to employment opportunities for local people" said Bob Elkington, Manager of Economic Development recently. "It is vital that people can put their skills and experience to good use and help to drive our recovery and rebuilding process" he added.
