EMAIL FROM PAULINE IN BURMA WITH JENNY WEBB

"This country and its people continue to amaze. Have discovered a little more about its recent history post 1947 and why next year's elections could be so interesting, especially as the constitution has now been altered to accommodate minority ethnic groups. Continue to cause great amusement with all the children we meet as I try to remember their names and then PRONOUNCE them!! If I thought that Polish had a few too many consonants I'm beginning to think that Burmese may have a similar problem. However laughter is a constant sound here and we all have a great time. So far it doesn't matter where or what we've eaten ALL the food has been delicious, well okay with the exception of fish paste and fermented tea leaves. But we have had tofu to die for...hard to believe I know, although the BBQ and salads at the Australian embassy on Sunday night (we had the fish) was a pleasant change of pace, not a rice bowl in sight. On Monday we left Yangon and headed for the sacred Buddhist site -Golden Rock - up in the mountains. Definitely worth the long drive and the hike up the mountain, not to mention the bus trip up the mountain beforehand on the back of a truck- OH&S be damned. The driver kept discovering new gears!! We stayed at the Mountain Top Hotel that night and got up very early yesterday morning to watch the sun rise. Due to the cloud cover it was a bit of a non-event but still worth getting up for. On the way back to Yangon we visited a 300 pupil school run by Buddhist monks and chatted with real monks and then had a ball with all the students. The novice monks were probably the cheekiest kids there. The weather continues to be hot and sticky and I must admit that I am quite looking forward to a very cold night in front of the fire!! Only one last day to shop as well as teach some English to a group of high school students at the sewing centre. Last time Peter taught them all how to make propellers, not too sure what tomorrow holds. We both want to come back and explore further up country, inland, and meet more of the most gentle, caring people we have ever had the delight to know. " .Thanks Pauline Roberts, it sounds like a marvellous experience and hopefully Jenny will be offering this trip again.

THANK YOU GBCMA

The Granite News has received a Community Education grant from the Goulburn Broken Catchment Management Authority (GBCMA) for printing and administrative costs. This will enable us to continue next year as funding to Landcare from the Federal Government has virtually dried up and we have been concerned about our future. Many thanks for supporting this community newsletter.

Due to the financial pressures on Landcare we will ask groups who wish to include inserts in TGN to print and deliver them to us rather than us covering the printing costs. I hope that seems fair to everyone.

RABBITS GALORE

There has been a lot of discussion in the community about the number of rabbits in our district. Again, we are concerned that the government does not understand the enormous job that land owners and Landcare, through subsidized ripping hours, does to help combat this problem. The HCCC is looking into the feasibility of 1080 carrots for this area. As you will be aware there have been a number of changes made to the use of 1080 and it has turned into a very complex area. Many farmers have found that the poisoned oats are not as effective as the carrots in their country and would like to see the reintroduction of the carrots.

In order to let the government know the extent of the rabbit problem the HCCC would like to encourage everyone to assist by participating in the Rabbit Scan programme. This has been in The Granite News in the past but the HCCC executive felt that it was worth printing again due to the growing rabbit problem. We encourage as many people as possible to participate and fill in the survey.

RABBITSCAN

This a nation-wide challenge for community and schools to help scientists map where rabbits are, by asking people to 'scan' their landscape (school, farm, parkland, roadside reserves, etc) for signs of rabbits and their damage, and to load their results online" We are trying to determine the distribution and density of rabbits in Australia. We know that rabbits are coming back after more than a decade significant relief through calicivirus. When we look, we are finding populations further north than our current maps indicate and in great densities in some coastal areas, for example. The densities are important, because we have a greater awareness of the impact of low rabbit numbers on native vegetation.

"Try and go for a walk this week and log on yourself. We did it as a family in an area we walk a lot, but it was quite a different experience for us to take note of rabbit signs and damage the boys found three warrens that we must have walked past a hundred times before and never really noted."


