PEOPLE AND PLACES

With the announcement earlier this year that a Goulburn River Rail Trail is going to be built along the disbanded rail tracks between Tallarook and Mansfield, it's timely to remember some of the forgotten history related to the old rail line when it was operational. Colin Smith recalls one of his memories and hopes others have more to share.

TRAWOOL RAILWAY STATION & RIVER CROSSING

In the late forties and early fifties the Trawool Station was manned, also had a siding for unloading stock and other goods. In those days the river was crossed by a bridge built during the war and beside the bridge on the upstream side was what remained of the old bridge. All that remained was the piles, the decking which was rotten and had plenty of gaps, most of it loose, no rails on the sides and no railing on the approaches to the bridge.

Dad, Murray and I rode from "Greenslopes" down to the Station to unload a mob of cattle one morning. From memory we unloaded them onto the platform for some reason. They were a motley lot too and I think not in very good condition. We herded them in the right direction and they started to race down the road towards the river

Not thinking they would take on the old bridge we let them go, but to our astonishment that's the very thing they did.

If you can imagine a rickety old structure with fifteen steers in single file floundering across, legs going through the gaps, bits falling off the bridge, the whole structure shaking. It would have been about thirty feet above the river and much to our consternation it looked like something must collapse but providence was with us and they all made it across.

The cattle slowed down in their rush and gave us a chance to get ahead and turn them in the right direction along the road to "Greenslopes".

FIRE RESTRICTIONS COME INTO FORCE

Fire restrictions come into force in the Shires of Mitchell and Murrindindi on the 30th November 2009 at 1am.

The Community Information maps within the Township Protection Plans (TPPs) for the 52 high risk bushfire towns have been uploaded on the CFA web site and are now available to the public. All maps are draft unless otherwise listed. As TPPs are approved by councils and Neighbourhood Safer Places are designated over time, the maps will be amended to final versions.

FREE GREEN WASTE AND HARD WASTE DISPOSAL

Disposal of eligible green waste and hard waste material will be freeof charge at all Resource Recovery centres from17th November to31st December. This is being provided to assist in property clean up for the upcoming fire season. Funding for this offer is provided through the Victorian Bushfire Appeal Fund. No limit on quality. Offer applies only tor residents/ property owners in the Murrindindi Shire. Does not apply to waste from commercial premises or building waste. To ensure eligibility a copy of current rates notice must be presented to the site attendant on arrival. Residents wanting to use a commercial contractor to dispose of their clean-up waste must make prior arrangements with Council's Coordinator Waste Management. Green waste and hard waste should be delivered in separate loads or be easily separable at time of disposal. A pre booked collection service is being offered to people who genuinely cannot do so eg elderly, disabled, etc. Contact the Shire to organise this.

SOME BENEFITS FROM UNDERSTORY PLANTING

- · Did you know that our native daisies attract several butterfly species that only lay their eggs on mistletoe? And when the caterpillars hatch, they eat mistletoe so thoroughly they destroy whole clumps!
- · Our local wattles are useful too. They are a magnet for Squirrel Gliders looking for a feed of sugary sap. And here's the interesting bit: the Gliders also clean up leaf-eating insects that are at the root of dieback in your trees. A single Glider can eat over 20 kgm of Christmas Beetles during just one summer!!
- · Then there's all the birds which nest or shelter in the understorey shrubs. Did you know that birds take up to 60% of the available insects in a healthy woodland? Planting the right shrubs will help put an end to the relentless insect attacks on your valuable old trees.
- · And that's only half the story! Nectar-rich shrubs like Sweet Bursaria, Tea Trees, Rice Flowers and Everlasting Daisies also attract a range of parasitic wasps and flies that are very helpful to the farmer. With nectar as their energy source, these wasps will hunt all day for insect pests like Cockchafer Grubs, Christmas Beetle larvae and Grass Hoppers that destroy valuable pastures!


