One of the great attractions of collecting the stories of Terip is the journey into that often maligned territory of nostalgia. When I watched the Australian film, Celia on ABC 2 on Saturday night, I have to confess, I indulged in a night of nostalgia.

The film was about a family in Surrey Hills during Henry Bolte's reign as premier. The details of the period - clothing, housing, hair-dos and the gang of children running free in the wild spaces that still existed in the suburbs - were all just right.

Why mention it in TGN? it was also about the misadventures of Murgatroyd, white, with one black ear, Celia's pet rabbit. Celia's father bought him/her in return for a promise that she would not play with the communist children next door.

When the rabbit problem besetting the country was mentioned, Celia said that it was only brown ones that were pests. Poor Murgatroyd was confiscated and died in captivity, just before a permit for her/his release was obtained.

Who, as child or adult hasn't faced a conflict of interests involving an animal?

Robyn Richards, who still describes herself as an animal girl, when asked about her school days at Terip wrote:

'So animal orientated was I, I remember Wesley Green bought two small kitten rabbits to school one day, which I purchased from him for 10 cents each. He had caught them ferreting over the weekend!! I am happy to say that Bonnie and Clyde lived for many years and produced many offspring.

Later Robyn added, '. . .the local farmers, including my own father, would have been horrified that I had such an extensive "common" rabbit breeding program happening in the back yard. (all which stemmed from Bonnie and Clyde)

However I would now argue with passion that the skills derived from the responsibility of nurturing such a successful breeding program have stood me in good stead for the many challenges I have faced as a farmer, vet nurse and even mother!!!

BITS OF BOTANY AND BIRDS

OWLS

Andrew Hubbard and Helaine Stanley saw a Barking Owl at their hideaway towards the back of Three Sisters not long after last year's fires, and have continued to hear its distinctive calls – both the dog-like "wook-wook" and the blood-curdling human-like scream.

This is really encouraging as DSE staff, who have been monitoring Victorian owl populations since 2000, have recently warned that owl populations, particularly the large Powerful Owl and the Sooty Owl, are declining.

The downward trend in owl numbers is thought to be due to the combination of drought and fires, which have impacted on their natural prey (gliders and possums), and destroyed old trees with large hollows, which are needed for nesting.

Relatively smaller owls, including the Barking Owl, may be better able to sustain themselves on insects in harsh times, but of course still need hollows.


