BITS OF BOTANY AND BIRDS



MISTLETOE

Mistletoes are parasites that grow on and feed off other trees. A few clumps won't harm a healthy host tree, but large infestations may kill if there are other stress factors as well. Grey Mistletoe (Amyema quandang) grows on wattles and has grey-green leaves with flowers pointing upwards. Drooping mistletoe (Amyema pendulum) grows on both Eucalyptus and wattles and has thinner darker leaves, often with an orange tinge, and flowers pointing down. I've seen both species growing together on the one tree. Both have thin stalklike flowers branching off other stalks which branch off a central stalk, like an elaborate candelabra.

RUFFY STORE SECRETS NIGEL'S RASPBERRY AND ALMOND SLICE RECIPE

Pre heat oven to 175 deg. Grease 30cm x 15cm slice tin and line with baking paper.

200g flour

100g unsalted butter

50g caster sugar

Whizz in Magimix until crumb like then press into prepared tin bake 10min/175 deg. Allow to cool slightly in the tin.

3 eggs

125g caster sugar - beaten together until white.

Lightly mix together 50g fine desiccated coconut and 100g ground almonds (almond meal) then fold into egg and sugar mixture.

Spread Ruffy Raspberry jam over cooked shortcake then evenly cover with almond mixture.

Bake for 20min @ 165 deg.


