HIGH PRAISE FOR ROCKY PASSES

I recently went on a quick trip to Spain and Argentina. Okay, it was only overnight. And it was less than a two-hour drive from Melbourne. My girlfriend Beth and I went to a Tapas Night at Rocky Passes Estate in Whiteheads Creek near Seymour. Rocky Passes is owned and run by Candi Westney and Victor Oles (who is also an incredibly gifted wood craftsmen). Candi is Australian and Victor is Argentinean, but they whip up some of the best Spanish tapas I have ever eaten. And it was all washed down with their delectable red wines. We started with a bottle of Shiraz Cabernet blend (their most popular) and moved onto a bottle of... we're not sure. The wine was so nice, and was going down way too quickly, that we can't recall what we drank next. I did recall what we ate, though. Well, I kept a copy of the menu at least and I knew what we'd eaten because we ate EVERY tapas on the list. Just to make you salivate a little this is what we ate:

Albondigas (herbed meatballs in rich tomato salsa)

Alcachofas borrachas (Artichokes in a wine reduction)

Bunuelos de coliflor (Cauliflowers and cheese fried dumplings with mustard salsa)

Chorizos (Grilled Spanish sausage) Empanadas (Sweet spiced pork parcels in pastry)

Gambas piri piri (Grilled prawns with a ginger, garlic and chilli salsa)

Pimientos y alcaparras (Roasted red peppers with capers)

Queso de obeja (Sheep's milk cheese)

And then, if we weren't full enough, we had both desserts:Panna cotta con frutillas (Creamy pudding with strawberries and coulis)

Torta de almendras (Almond cake with orange liquor syrup).



BITS OF BOTANY AND BIRDS

Crane's bill (Geranium potentilloides)

This native geranium is a straggly ground-cover herb, quite unlike its bushy garden relative. The flower shape is similar – 5 roughly even petals, but much smaller and paler - about 1cm across and a delicate pink. The leaves are roundish but with 5 or so deep indentations. Don't confuse them with pennyworts (hydrocotyle), which also have roundish leaves but with scalloped edges rather than deep indentations.

LOCUSTS LOOK OUT

Locals are being asked to be vigilant when it comes to reporting locusts.

The Department of Primary Industries has developed an interactive map that provides extensive information on locust movements and sightings.

"DPI scientists have determined the areas of greatest egg bed concentration are in the North, North Western, and Central parts of Victoria. The department is concentrating its efforts on reducing as much as possible the number of plague locusts that survive to full maturity.

"Their aim is to reduce the threat of plague locusts this spring and summer because once plague locusts reach maturity they are able to travel long distances including southern Victoria, however at that stage, it is much more difficult to undertake effective spraying.

IS THAT PLANT POISONOUS?

An Australian field guide for livestock, pets and people' by R.C.H. Shepherd This book covers the large number of plants found on farms and bush blocks, along roadsides, in waste places and as weeds in gardens. It includes hundreds of colour photographs to aid identification and information about who the plant is poisonous to (cattle, sheep, goats, horses, domestic pets, humans), which parts of the plant are poisonous and the toxins likely to be encountered, as well as symptoms of poisoning. Symptoms are also listed according to plant species and animal in a comprehensive appendix.

Its publication is supported by the Council of Australasian Weed Societies, Weed Society of Victoria, The Weed Society of New South Wales and The Weed Society of Western Australia.




