BITS OF BOTANY AND BIRDS

Hop bitter-pea (Daviesia latifolia)

This straggly shrub is common along the roadsides in Caveat. At a distance the leathery leaves look vaguely like a broad-leafed eucalypt, though with wavy leaf edges. At this time of year it has masses of sprays of pea-flowers, coloured yellow with a red/brown centre, a colour combination that is sometimes called eggs and bacon and is very common among native pea-flowers.


