
Managing Steep Hills

- A transformation at Berdue Station





Berdue Station on the outskirts of Alexandra, (approximately 2000 acres) has worked consistently over the past 6 years to land class fence the bald hills, increase ground cover back on the hills to retain soils, increase biodiversity and connectivity across the property through revegetation, and eventually bring the hills back into sustainable grazing by lightly stocking sites as required. Paterson's Curse has been controlled on the hills although Blackberry continue to be a major headache to control. The property has some of the steepest hills in the district and beautiful Goulburn River frontage. Come hear and see first hand the transformation of the property, the ongoing challenges, and the practical aspects of costs and stocking rates to achieve these results.
