Clean Up Carp Day


ABOUT THE MACQUARIE PERCH

Macquarie perch (Macquaria australiasica) is a nationally endangered fish species which has more remnant populations persisting in the Goulburn Broken Catchment than any other region within Victoria. However, these populations are highly fragmented and largely restricted to unregulated tributaries of the Goulburn River, one of which is the Hughes Creek.

These remaining Macquarie perch populations are at risk of becoming isolated or locally extinct during future extreme environmental events such as drought and bushfire.

A long term goal in the recovery for this species within the Goulburn Broken Catchment is to improve connectivity between populations. For the Hughes Creek, this involves protecting their current stronghold and enhancing adjoining habitat to extend their range along the Creek. In particular, working downstream to reconnect Macquarie perch with the Goulburn River.

Reducing predation and competition from introduced fish species (carp and redfin) in the Hughes Creek is another priority action identified that would help to increase the Macquarie perch population.
