The Yea Saleyards has held its first stud sale with the dispersal of the Crystal Creek Gelbvieh Stud, which operates out of Alexandra.




Buyers from across the state, NSW and Tasmania attended the sale conducted by Landmark Embling on behalf of the stud.

Mayor John Walsh said the Saleyards Committee would continue to build on such days.

"The committee will now explore what facilities are needed to hold multivendor stud sales by partnering with livestock agents and breed societies. "This was an important step in the business plan for the facility and another tool to develop the local beef industry,"

Cr Walsh said.


