WILDLIFE NEST BOX PROJECT

We ran an article in TGN Issue 2 2013 about the work of Chris Cobern and his nest box project in the fire recovery

Chris has submitted an update via Judy Brookes.

"Photos attached of a Brush-tailed Phascogale and Sugar Gliders at one of our nest boxes we installed on a farm in Flowerdale.



When I inspected the boxes with the inspection camera recently I thought the nest looked like a phascogale by the nesting material and scats inside the box. So I set up one of our remote cameras on a nearby tree.

These boxes were built by students from Greensborough Secondary College and only installed in November last year. Of the 9 boxes we installed there, 7 had gliders or nests present.



We've had great results from our nest box project. Of the almost 400 nest boxes installed about 2/3rds have been used already.

Fauna has included Brush-tailed Phascogales, Sugar Gliders, Agile Antechinus, Ringtail Possums, Brush-tailed Possums, Eastern Rosella, White-throated Treecreeper and Owlet Nightjar.

Pest species have only included 2 x bee hives and 1 x Indian Myna nest."

ROVER SCOUTS' MUDBASH

Victoria's Rover Scouts are getting ready to rev their engines at their annual car racing event, Mudbash, at Mafeking Rover Park at Caveat on the Queen's Birthday long weekend.



The 41-year-old event sees Rover Scouts, aged 18-26, compete across a series of tracks and obstacles to determine who will be named Mudbash Champion.

The highlight of the event, the obstacle course, sees crews take their cars against a series of large mud-filled holes to the cheers of spectators. What began as a small gathering of five Rover crews and their cars in Big River in 1972 has grown into the largest annual Rover Scout event in Australia.

Who are the Rover Scouts?

Rovers is the oldest section of the Scout movement and is for males and females aged between 18-26 years. Rovers are usually looking to get involved in the outdoors, making friends for life as well as service to the community and Scouting.

Typically Rovers enjoy helping others, having a great time and taking on new challenges.

Many Rovers have been in Scouting before, this is not a pre-requisite, you do not have to have years of experience in Scouting to fit in, know how to tie knots or put up a tent!

You do need to have a "give it a go" attitude and want to be involved with people your own age, be part of the wider community, and have some serious fun along the way.
