WINTER WILDLIFE OBSERVATIONS in MAGGIES LANE

An opportunity to get up to the Ruffy district again presented itself at the end of my current leave and the forecasted cold and wet conditions didn't stop us from seeing (but mostly hearing) various native species in this part of Victoria.

The onset of wet and cold weather certainly dampened the detection of birds but our visit to the Maggies Lane area north of Ruffy still managed to detect 27 species and the usual Grey Kangaroos plus Common Wombats and a Red Fox.

I can recommend a visit to this area at any time of year and it helps if you can recognise birds by their calls, especially during wintry conditions.

There were two highlights for the weekend. One was seeing a pair of Crested Shrike-tits foraging in a patch of wattles and eucalypts. These yellow, black and white birds have a sturdy beak they use to peel back bark on smoothbarked eucalypts where they find insects, larvae and spiders as food. Their presence can often be detected by the calls (one of which is 'knock-atthe-door') or the tearing of bark from tree branches and trunks. The species is threatened in parts of Australia but is probably still secure here in Victoria. Next time you're out near any suitable habitat, have a listen for this wonderful bird with the Mohican-like 'crest'. Another of our native birds with real character.



The other was observing a pair of juvenile Eastern Grey Kangaroos 'playing'. One animal would stand in front of the other, rear up with chest exposed and then race around in loops at high speed before returning to the other animal. This behaviour wasn't well coordinated though and the rearing kangaroo kept losing its balance (falling sideways) which looked quite comical in the drizzly conditions.


LOCAL GOINGS ON

A huge thank you to Julia and Scott McKay for their generosity and hard work. Money raised from last year's Wool Shed Dance went towards a 5


week swimming program for all students and subsidising school camps to make them more accessible.
