CAVEAT'S MUDBASH-2013 a 'ROARING' SUCCESS

Rover Scouts is for young adults aged between 18 and 26, which through a diverse range of activities helps develop community leaders.

Victoria's Rover Scouts put their hard work into practice at their annual car racing event, 'MUDBASH', held at Caveat's Mafeking Rover Park on the Queen's Birthday long weekend.

Attracting over 800 campers and an additional 500 visitors on open day, a huge number of people were in attendance for what is the premier event on the Rovers' motorsport calendar.



The event saw Rovers compete in buggies across a series of tracks and obstacles to determine who would be named Mudbash Champion.

Just under 40 buggies competed this year, with the infamous obstacle course again being the highlight for the spectators.

Mudbash Chairman Louise Pocock said "Rover Scout Crews look forward to Mudbash every year and it's really great to watch them competing after all their hard work building the cars."

The cars, a mix of sedans and frame buggies compete in a series of races during the two-day event.

The Open Day on Sunday was once again a great day and is always a brilliant opportunity for the general public and members of the other Scouting sections to witness all the best of Rovering in one day.

There were heaps of fun activities for the kids including archery, abseiling, bouldering wall, face painting and live bands, plus everyone had the chance to watch Rover Scouts in action, getting dirty as they put their cars to the test against the mud.

On the Friday before the event began, some members of the Mudbash Committee took some buggies for a trip to visit **Highlands Primary School**, where they explained the event, showed off some of the vehicles and gave all of the students tickets to the open day.

A special mention must be given to the international team from New Zealand, who despite flying into Australia only the week before the event, managed to claim the overall win.
