TOM'S PADDOCK UNIQUE EGG PRODUCTION—By John Kennedy

Tom Abbotsmith Youl is the third generation famer to be involved with the family's Graceburn property at Glenburn.

Like most farmers he became concerned at the inability of a traditional family farm to yield a return to its owners and for its labour inputs in particular.

A year ago Tom attended a lecture presented by Joel Salatin a down to earth American organic small farmer, lecturer and author who practices environmentally responsible, ecologically beneficial and regenerative agriculture.

Salatin's thought provoking ideas about holistic farm management, methods of animal husbandry, free of potentially harmful chemicals and the sustainable agriculture that he practices on his own farm in Virginia caused Tom to think deeply about what new and potentially innovative enterprises he could introduce to the family property at Glenburn.

Tom settled on establishing this unique method of free range/nomadic egg production that he markets under his 'Tom's Paddock' brand name delivered regularly to a growing network of clients in the local Yea and Yarra Valley area.

Joel Salatin is also a key proponent of direct to the customer marketing and this was another route which appealed to Tom.

So he has invested his time, energy and capital in establishing a paddock reared range of eggs which although only currently building up to a reasonable scale has also opened up ideas for other potential direct to the customer niche opportunities for farm produce.



Although free range in the paddock egg production has some established practices Tom has adopted one of these as well as implementing his own production ideas.

Currently he has built up to about 450 nomadic hens but his target is to shortly have 900 hens moving around the family property.

An added bonus from Tom's egg business is that his hens provide their manure which enhances pasture growth.

At the present time Tom is concentrating on commercial clients who can take a box of 150 fresh eggs on a regular weekly basis.

So the growth of the cafe culture both locally and in the Yarra Valley is an important market for 'Tom's Paddock' pastured eggs.

The resident wedge tail eagles pose a threat to hens running outdoors but the incidence of eagle attacks appears to have been reduced just by stringing some colourful bunting over the hen's grazing area.

Tom is not anticipating to get rich from paddock egg production.

PEOPLE and PLACES

Throughout the north east there is an established and expanding artisan community.

Fortunately we have a wealth of accomplished practitioners of the arts including painters, potters and crafts people of all types based in our local districts.

Gary Male the artisan woodworker from Yea sees his name recognised quite regularly in a local context but is gaining increased and much wider appreciation for his woodworking skills.

Gary and his business Gabra Timber Creations has been winning commissions from clients in the Melbourne metropolitan area and throughout Victoria and he has recently completed commissions on behalf of clients as far afield as the Australian Capital Territory.



Gary has spent all his life involved in timber and especially carpentry.

Apart from commissions received Gary always has a stock of his completed woodwork on display and for sale at Yea's Gallery 34.

Gary says that 'real timber' is the key to his creative works.

"I can quite often source a log locally and recently I have been making buying trips to the Island Specialty Timbers depot in Geeveston Tasmania where some of the best woods available are offered for sale.

"They are usually expensive choices but the timber – including Black Heart Sassafras, Myrtle, Blackwood and Huon Pine can be judged as the best quality material available in Australia.

"The graining especially of burl or fiddle back patterns is often quite exceptional" Gary says so he drives his ute down to Tassie to make his handpicked timber selection.

Gary says some time ago he found a red gum log on the ground in a farm paddock in the Limestone district near Yea.

"It was in the way of a planned dam excavation and the owner of the log pretty much regarded it as only useful for firewood.

"But it had been air dried for a long time and I judge it to have been from a tree that was about 300 years old when felled".

Although short in length it was just too good to waste so Gary bought the log and carefully milled it down into workable sections.

Gary has a preference for multiple coats of carefully applied lacquer and oils to give his work a final finish that over the long term should be enduring and require minimum maintenance.

Apart from his one off pieces to his own designs or to suit the preferences of his commission clients Gary also undertakes limited commercial projects.

The bars and tables in two of Yea's hotels are also testimony to his skills.

Gary's blanket box won the first Frank Hargraves Prize at the 2013 Yea Rotary Club Art Show and apart from the selection of his timber work of various types on show at Gallery 34 in Yea he will be having a major exhibition there later in the year.

BEEF SCHOOL

Local Beef Producers have the opportunity to participate in the third North-East Beef School at Dookie.

This event provides information and resources aimed at building skills and knowledge to manage difficult seasonal and market conditions.

Beef School is open to all beef producers.

The one-day activity, which is preceded by a dinner, combines relevant topics and leading industry speakers in a programme that includes practical activities in cattle yards and concurrent sessions allowing participants to select the topics most relevant to them.

Amongst a number of presenters, Tim McRae (MLA), Paul Cusack (Australian Livestock Production Services), Brian Cumming (Brian Cumming Agriculture), Claire Geri (Department of Environment and Primary Industries) will cover topics from the market situation, nutritional management techniques to obtain good production in ruminants, bull structure through to how the rumen functions.

Darren Hickey, DEPI 'BetterBeef' Project Manager, said that due to the successes of last year's events and, more recently, the Gippsland Beef School in May, where close to 100 participants attended, we are again conducting the school in partnership with Goulburn Ovens TAFE this year.

"Commercial cattle producers tell us that they value the hands-on and practical nature of the beef schools. The live animal assessment exercises in the yards are always very popular as is the hands-on nature of other sessions.

Breaking into smaller groups and having closer interaction with the technical experts is highly valued by participants," Mr Hickey said.
