Sometimes casual contacts can have unpredictable consequences. Such was the case when Freya Stokell met Jenny Webb from Highlands at a function at Habbies Howe.

Jenny was telling Helen Macdougall and Freya how she would love to have a qualified chef to do some work with her in Myanmar; Helen immediately volunteered "Oh, Freya could do that!"

Freya started her career as an apprentice chef in her home city of Hobart but in her 3<sup>rd</sup> year she decided she wanted to play in the main game so packed up and moved to Melbourne. Not only was it closer to the action, but it was closer to the snow that Freya loved so much.

Working across the range of bistro food, creative Pub food as well as fine dining, she rounded out her experience and found herself managing a ski lodge at Mt Hotham. To offset the Australian season Freya worked at Canadian ski resorts in the northern winter but it was the attraction of working at the much awarded regional Tea Rooms of Yarck that brought Freya to our district..and she just loves it.

Following up on her meeting with Jenny Webb, Freya jumped at the opportunity to contribute to Jenny's work in Myanmar as a visiting professional. She has just returned from two weeks there where she delivered a food handling, safety & hygiene course.

#### "FOX ON THE RUN" COMPETITION A HUGE SUCCESS

HCCC Landcare's "Fox on the Run" competition for June 2013 has proven to be a huge success with a total of **431 Foxes shot**.

On Friday 9th August an awards dinner was held at the Ruffy Hall, catered by the Ruffy Rec Reserve ladies and attended by 30 members of the local community.

**George & Mark Noye** won the Teams Priize of a trophy made from local Granite plus a cheque for \$500 for their outstanding effort of **131** shot Foxes.

The Runner Up Team, brothers **Dave & Wayne Ambrosini** were presented with a cheque for \$250 for their tally of **82** tails.

In the Individual section **Brendan Leigh** took out the trophy with a total of **101** shot foxes. Brendan also received a cheque for \$500.

In his acceptance speech George Noye said that he & Mark appreciated the recognition that they received for spending many cold nights on local hilltops doing farmers a favour. George went on to say that many farmers preferred to have responsible shooters attack their fox problem rather than use baiting programs. Baiting has obvious dangers and as George put it "you never know what result you get, whereas with shooting you get to see an instant result".

George & Mark's best single night tally was 17 foxes, but one night they shot 10 foxes in just one paddock.

On this theme, Brendan also bagged 17 foxes on one night but the Ambrosini brothers' could claim the best single night result with a tally of 25.

## WHAT'S GOING ON OUT THERE? HCCC Landcare Cameras Will Tell You!

At our recent community meetings there has been strong interest in using new technologies to monitor native fauna and feral species.

As a result of this community input, HCCC Landcare has purchased six new movement activated cameras.

**Bandicoot**, **QuoII** and **Phascogale** spotters will now be able to record the presence and movement of any rare native fauna AND **Fox**, **Deer** and **Black Panther** hunters will also be invited to take advantage of this Landcare initiative.

A training session on the use of these cameras will be run at the Tablelands Community Centre (Old Ruffy School) on Saturday 24th August from 10am-11am followed by morning coffee at the Ruffy Produce Store.

Anyone interested in borrowing our cameras should attend this training

Colin Cook runs a business called "Monitor Cameras" and is an expert on setting up and using wildlife cameras. He is supplying our cameras and will run the training session.

The cameras will be available for loan from the Landcare office Please contact Janet Hagen if you are interested in attending.
