JIM and JILL came up the HILL

Just about everyone who lives in our wonderful Strathbogies region wouldn't wish to live anywhere else. Many were born to the district but their appreciation for the area has never worn thin.

Other folk have arrived here by various circuitous routes and have become instant converts. Such is the case for well known and respected Terip Terip couple Jim and Jill Davidson.

They arrived in the district in late 1979 intending to pursue the dream of owning their own piece of land after Jim's career in government and Jill's time out from nursing to raise their 3 children, but as it turned out, their working lives were about to take many different directions.

Jim had come to Melbourne with his family as a 9 year old Scottish lad from a small town between Edinburgh and Glasgow. His father was a baker who had run a successful business but with the closure of the local shale oil facility following the rise of the Middle East oil industry Jim's father realised that employment prospects were becoming limited so he decided to pursue a better future for his children in Australia.

Growing up in Melbourne's eastern suburb of Mitcham, Jim got to know young Jill from Donvale and as it turns out, he also played Under 16 footy with Ruffy's Doug Maclean who was also growing up in Mitcham.

Initially working as a PMG technician, Jim landed a job with the Vic Fisheries & Wildlife Dept making low power transmitters for native waterfowl tracking collars. Jill was just starting her nursing career when Jim was appointed to a position with the Fisheries Department at Port Fairy in 1965 and so began their first experience of country living. They were married in 1966 and spent 12 years on Victoria's magnificent south west coast before Jim was transferred to Cowes and then promoted to head office in Melbourne. Intent on pursuing their ambition of living & working in the country, Jim chose to resign and they searched this area for their tree change, as they had close friends at Strathbogie.

Jill took a nursing job at the Euroa Hospital and Jim revelled in the outdoor life as a farm labourer working with Roger Strong, Michael Hill and Helen McKenzie to name a few. They both became involved in the local community through the Terip Tennis Club, the Recreation Reserve and of course the Terip Fire Brigade.

Jim also became a respected volunteer on local school councils which led to an

unexpected offer of Regional School Council Liaison Officer with the Dept of Education in Benalla, finishing his career as Assistant Regional Director. Jill had become a District Nurse specialising in palliative care and following the tragic death of their 21 year old daughter Nicki, Jill was motivated to return to study a Grad Dip in Loss and Grief. After 7 years in the Regional Palliative Care Service, Jill is now in private practice as a Loss and Grief Counsellor and Consultant.

BOTANY, BIRDS & CREATURES

VEINED HELMET ORCHID Corybas diemenicus

Native orchids can be found at just about any time of year though spring and summer are the best, both for the numbers of species and their brilliant colours.

In late winter and early spring I normally look out for greenhoods, whose colour can make them hard to spot against the background vegetation.



I was searching a patch on my block where I'd seen them in previous years when I came across something different, and even easier to miss. A tiny little orchid with a dull purple hood and one green leaf.

The flower was about 1cm across and not much taller, and the leaf blended well into the mixture of kidney weed and hydrocotyles, groundcover which have similar-sized and coloured leaves.

It was the first helmet orchid I'd ever seen on my block, though it's not a particularly rare species.

It prefers moist shady sites and can grow in large colonies, so I was a bit surprised to find only one, though I searched the ground carefully around. Later, a few hundred metres away I found four similar leaves with no flowers so I'll keep an eye on them and see what develops.

And I never did find the greenhoods.
