### **MOTION SENSITIVE CAMERAS**

Want to know what's creeping around your property at night?

Is something eating your grapes, stripping your fruit trees, scaring the chooks?

Or perhaps that noise in the roof? Then borrow one of HCCC Landcare's motion sensitive cameras.



They can be strapped to a tree or post and left for several days or even weeks, and the resulting photos uploaded to your computer.

On our property we caught wombats, wallabies, roos, echidnas, possums, foxes, feral cats, rats, bandicoots and birds. And we were able to confirm that the big droppings in our kitchen were from antechinuses, not rats (good). We also got several thousand photos of waving vegetation (not so good).



The cameras have various menu options but as they didn't come with any instructions, we didn't mess with them too much. There is a video as well as a still setting.

What we got varied a lot – one site along a well-worn track got 6 different species of mammal, another similar spot got nothing. If we didn't have any luck we just moved it after a couple of nights. Normally we set it at not much above ground level but I also tried it on the woodshed roof, where all I got in a week was one possum.

## **KOALA FODDER TREES**

Koalas would have to be one of the most well loved Australian icons, however this hasn't always been the case.

In the early 20<sup>th</sup> century Koalas were hunted for the fur trade and between hunting, drought, disease, predation and reduction of habitat, their numbers have declined rapidly.



It is believed that in the 1930's numbers in Victoria were recorded to be below 1000. Over the years redistribution and repopulation activity's have been conducted with varying degrees of success, with the actual number of koalas an estimate due to some difficulty in assessing populations in some areas.

Koalas occur in eucalypt forests of eastern and southern mainland Australia, and are often seen within our catchment.

They prefer habitat within close proximity to riparian zones and wetter areas of the eucalypt forests.

As a native species the Koala is protected by law and cannot be intentionally harmed.

Koalas have a very specific preference for trees with only around 18 species classified as primary fodder trees.

The main trees in our area are Narrow-leaf Peppermint

- --*Eucalyptus radiata* Mountain Swamp-gum
- -- Eucalyptus camphora
  Southern Blue-gum
- --Eucalyptus globulus

although they are known to use other species for shelter and feeding. Recent studies suggest that they actually prefer to shelter in different species than those from which they feed.

They can eat between 200-500g of leaves per day which also supplies most of their water requirement.

The age of a Koala can also dictate which species of trees they show a preference for due to differing nutritional requirements.

Male Koalas tend to range further than females with averages of up to 1.2 Ha for females and up to 1.7 Ha for males. Some other species of trees that are considered primary fodder trees, and which are sometimes seen within the catchment are:

River Red-gum

—Eucalyptus camaldulensis Messmate Stringybark

— Eucalyptus obliqua Swamp-gum—Eucalyptus ovata

To help maintain our koala population we need to protect and extend our remnant vegetation, when planning shelter belts on our property we should also consider the appropriate species of tree for fodder is planted.


