### **HUGHES CREEK OILS...aren't Oils**

An oil-like film spotted on some sections of the Hughes Creek's surface earlier this month was caused by the breakdown of organic matter and is not cause for concern, says Goulburn Broken Waterwatch co-ordinator Kirsten Hogan.

Ms Hogan said a local landholder had recently reported sighting oil films around and below the Avenel gauging stations along Tarcombe Road.



"The Goulburn Broken Catchment Management Authority (CMA) asked me to investigate after a local resident brought in a photo, showing an oil-like film on the water's surface," Ms Hogan said.

"Water samples have been taken and the tests performed showed no results of concern. The dark overall colour of the water is associated with tannins leached from organic matter, which has built up in the shallow, slow moving waters of the Hughes Creek."

Ms Hogan said observations of "small fish near death" was likely attributed to low dissolved oxygen (DO) levels caused by low or no flow in the creek at the time.

"Since the report water levels have risen and the creek has begun to flow again, so it would be expected oxygen levels have improved," she said. "Oxygen is transferred to the water from the atmosphere and occurs at a much greater rate in flowing water than in still water."

Ms Hogan said the Goulburn Broken CMA was interested in the water quality data that Waterwatch collected along Hughes Creek.

"The data provides valuable information on the effectiveness of the Goulburn Broken CMA's Hughes Creek Project, which aims to enhance and extend suitable habitat and, ideally, the range of the Macquarie Perch population within the creek," she said.

"As a threatened species, Macquarie Perch is the main focus of the project, however the likely habitat enhancement activities to be undertaken will benefit all aquatic and terrestrial species that use the waterway."
