EATING OUR FERAL PESTS

It really does make a lot of sense to me to eat our pests, such as wild goats, venison and rabbits instead of letting them destroy our fragile environment. As long as all the common sense protocols are followed it can be a win-win result. Please don't write back with a list of O,H&S disaster stories.

So, supporting this belief is the description of a successful dinner party. It all started when recently a couple of local great white hunters headed off to South Australia and returned with enough goat meat for a serious but fun cook up (cook off among friends).

The result was as follows.

First course - a goat polpeton
(meatloaf!) in tomato sugo with a side
of broad beans sautéed in olive oil and
garlic.



Second course included half eggplants, slow oven baked until soft and creamy with an aromatic spicy goat "crumble" ... looked and smelled so good someone forgot to take a photo before it was all gone!

The recipe was from a fabulous cookbook called

'Jerusalem' by Yotam Ottolenghi. Instead of lamb we just substituted minced goat's meat.

The third course was a Moroccan goat curry served with cous cous and a beautiful salad of beetroot, fetta, almonds and pomegranate seeds ... sweet, spicy and gorgeous "crunch" in the texture from the last two.

Each dish was matched with a chosen wine and interesting conversation. In truth each course could have been a meal in itself and the only dessert we could manage was watermelon and mint, that was until someone produced some exquisite little custard and strawberry tarts, they were small...


