\$485M to be cut from LANDCARE

What Are They Thinking??

I had an hour in the car with Justus Hagen on Friday and, like everyone else in the country, our conversation turned to the recent Federal budget.

The Federal Government makes much of its desire to devolve responsibility for Health and for Education to the local level where, they claim, these crucial services can most effectively & efficiently be delivered and managed.

Personally, I cannot think of a better example where such a devolved model has worked than with LANDCARE.

Most farmers and rural folk have an ingrained sense of environmental responsibility, partly because they live with the effects & indirect costs of past insensitive environmental practices.

But farmers tend to be a conservative bunch and they don't take kindly to people turning up at their gate and telling them how to do things. The current Landcare model has been so wonderfully effective because it combines two potent ingredients: SELF INTEREST and SELF HELP.

As with most new things, Landcare had its early adopters while others took longer to be convinced, but a significant factor in Landcare's success has been the 'over the fence' learning. When a well respected neighbouring farmer demonstrates the benefits of planting indigenous trees & understory, fencing off streams, bogs & swamps and re-establishing wildlife corridors there is a measurable snowball effect throughout the district.

I heard Barnaby Joyce on radio a few days ago telling us that The Green Army will be funded by the cuts to Landcare and that they will pick up where Landcare leaves off.

So, from right across Australia one or more of the 16,000 members of The Green Army will somehow find their way to your farm gate to do what you and Landcare have been doing so very effectively for decades.

I reckon this is a classic case of trying to fix something that's not broken.



FARMING & ENVIRONMENT

Messmate Stringybark Eucalyptus obliqua

The Messmate was one of the first eucalypt species to be described by French botanist L'Heritier in 1788. It is widespread in wet forest areas and some coastal localities throughout South Australia, Victoria, Tasmania and eastern New South Wales.



The messmate's timber is commonly used in general construction, furniture, panelling and flooring.

This is a very foxy tree that tolerates drought well once established and can recover well after fire.

The messmate tree is also favoured by koalas as a food source.

Family: Myrtaceae Height: to 90 metres Lifespan: 80 plus years Growth rate: Moderate to fast Soil preferred: Well drained, sandy/ clay loams

Appearance: Tall tree (no kidding), in poorer soils can be small with many branches, thick, rough fibrous stringy bark

Flowers: White flowers from December to February, can sometimes flower year round



An Exhibition of Pastel works by Hurstbridge artist, Kylie Sirett.

Kylie began using pastel as a medium because of its ability to accommodate life's little interruptions, and over the past few years has developed her own unique style.

Kylie's recent work focuses on the strong shadows that objects create and she draws inspiration for her intimate still life works from her immediate surroundings; seeing strength in the objects original design. She boldly re-creates objects through her complex layers of colour built up from short strokes of pastel,

LOCAL GARDENING WORKSHOPS

We still have two more workshops to go in the series .

On 27th May at the Tablelands Community Centre award winning landscape designer Brian Rankin will return to finalise our plans.

On 19th June the last workshop will be held at the Euroa Arboretum, learning how and when to take cuttings from native plants.

If you would like to try your hand with cuttings, its best to get some good tips of plants – around 20cm length. Pop them straight into a plastic bag with some moisture and keep them cool – refrigerate if collecting the night before. But fresh is best. Very new, soft growth will wilt like crazy and not work – best to use quite robust stems. Or plant material will be available at the Arboretum on the day, cost for this workshop is \$5 per person to cover materials.
