NEST BOXES for WILDLIFE

The Nest Box project was conceived to enhance habitat in the district for arboreal mammals, that is those that live in tree hollows.

Some of the very special animals still sharing our landscape with us are Sugar and Squirrel Gilders and Brush Tailed Phascogales.

They need hollows to live in and also need understorey wattles in particular as well as old trees.

To help them, the group has installed nest boxes along Lambing Gully Road, and also has planted trees and understorey where there were significant gaps in the linear corridor. North South corridors are very important to wildlife as they are climate sensitive and the weather is warming.



Ray Thomas will be familiar to many readers. Ray has kindly agreed to come down and share some stories. He has many years' experience in conservation having run a highly successful nest box project in the Lurg Hills.

In 2009 Ray was awarded the 'Conservationist of the Year' award by the Australian Geographic Society, in recognition of his 20 years of work on the Regent Honeyeater Project. Under his watch, the project has become one of the most active volunteer conservation projects in the nation, involving roughly 28,000 volunteers, planted more than 500,000 trees & shrubs, rehabilitated more than 1450 ha of farm land, brought 15 rare birds back from the brink of local extinction and installed 400 nest boxes.

Whiteheads Creek Landcare group is hosting a Nest Boxes for Wildlife day.

'ANDY' WILSON'S 90th BIRTHDAY — CELEBRATED IN STYLE

On Saturday 17th May Irene (Andy) Wilson from Ruffy (Godolphin) celebrated her 90th birthday with family and friends at the Ruffy Produce Store. Andy was able to welcome her son Eric Jamieson from NSW and her brother from WA as well her other three children Robert Jamieson, Jean Jansen and Dot Petersen.

Andy was born in Carlton Victoria on the 21 May 1924, but as a child lived in Albany



1924, but as a child lived in Albany Western Australia. She was the eldest of three children.

Hazel Anderson, her mother, died when Andy was only 12 years old. After her mother died she was fostered by her Aunt.

At 18 she left Western Australia and joined the Air Force. Andy became an Instrument Mechanic and was based at various places around Victoria, including Sale where she met her first husband. Phil Jamieson.

Andy always suspected that she might have a brother, as on one occasion she overheard a conversation between family members and they referred to "Ray". Her determination to find him saw her first leave pass from the Air force used to head to WA to try to find her brother. After much investigation and searching she finally found that her brother had been made a ward of the state. Support and contact saw the brother and sister reunited and they have stayed the best of friends.

After almost 40 years of married life and living in Swan Hill Andy received a phone call one day from her brother Ray telling her that they had a sister.

Through the Jigsaw program a third sibling "Laurie" who was living in Sydney had traced a brother and a sister.

Jigsaw made contact to ask if they were interested in meeting their sister. This child was adopted just after birth to a family who eventually lived in Sydney. Laurie and

Andy met for the first time about 30 years ago on a very hot January day in Swan Hill. Laurie and her husband Jo travelled to Swan Hill from their home in Sydney and the joy of finding a sister was very evident. The three siblings Irene, Ray and Laurie finally all met in Sydney and had a few days together to catch up on a life time of missed family life. There have been various visits over the years and they are still in constant contact. An amazing bond between three siblings with such a challenging start to their life as a family.

At 71 Andy took on a new challenge married John Wilson and moved to Albury and a new life on the farm. She was a farm girl at heart and her happiness to get to go and live back on a farm was evident. Her subsequent move to Ruffy has seen the farm return to its original condition with chickens, *foxy*, pet lambs fish, the occasional visiting snake, possums, fruit trees and a vegetable garden that grows regular food for a lot of the Ruffy Community. She visits friends and neighbours on the Gator and before that the quad bike. She is the world's best Vet, as the baby lambs or calves that are orphaned or rejected are adopted by Andy and the paddocks have many animals that are alive due to her care. You often get one or two sheep run out of the mob for a pat.

Very few families experience the very sad circumstances that Andy, Ray and Laurie had, however Andy has become a strong advocate of family life and her children, grandchildren and great grandchildren are her joy. Andy and Phil had 5 children, Eric, Ellen (deceased), Jean, Dorothy and Robert. She has 12 Grandchildren and 16 Great Grand Children.

She mows all the lawns on her ride on mower and if you visit the farm you'll notice that the place is spick and span. Her kitchen is always neat and clean.

Not bad for a 90 year old.
