## RUFFY ROADSIDE CLEARING —THE FINAL WORDS?

A meeting was held at the corner of Noye Lane and Bunting's Hill Road, Ruffy last month to discuss the management of roadsides leading to the Ruffy Neighbourhood Safer Place. Present were John Furlanetto (Ruffy CFA), Gary Washusen (Strathbogie Shire), Phil Hawkey (CFA Vegetation Officer), Janet Hagen (Landcare), Justus Hagen (Ruffy Community Action Group), Nigel Waterhouse (DEPI Alexandra) and Susan Sleigh (Longwood Plains CMN) Susan posed a number of questions about the work done by the Shire & CFA and the processes that were followed. Phil explained the 'Community Safer Place' requirements and how these overrode the existing vegetation protection regulations. The correct permits had been applied for and approved by DEPI.

Nigel Waterhouse had identified an endangered species in the area and stipulated that no trees with hollows were to be burnt. John Furlanetto explained that the large tree that fell down was never meant to burn, it had been inspected for hollows but they weren't spotted.

More care will be taken in the future. The burn was undertaken with good intentions. Phil Hawkey noted that in all burn-offs unforeseen things can and do happen, even though planning for burns commences many months before the event.

Gary Washusen said that the roadside mulching was a trial, and that it was supposed to go no more than 1.5 metres from the road shoulder, but because large amounts of fallen timber were to be removed the operators had to go in further this time. Gary also pointed out that the safety of the road for drivers was of utmost importance and that the Shire was obliged to maintain the roadsides and keep vegetation from encroaching too far.

Janet requested that Landcare be included in the planning stages in future as they can assist the Strathbogie Shire in making roadsides safer, especially in areas identified as having significant vegetation. Since the meeting, Verena and Erwin Weinmann have demonstrated how community members can assist the Shire to clean up in an environmentally sensitive manner. With Shire approval, they tidied up the area

Shire approval, they tidied up the area across the road from the fire shed as part of the Ruffy streetscape improvement plan.

Nigel Waterhouse from DEPI pointed out that permits are required before any landholder clears native vegetation older than 10 years from shire managed land; and that includes our roadsides.

- You must ensure your own safety and that of all road users when collecting firewood
