GEOLOGIST STRIKES a RICH VEIN of INTEREST at CREIGHTONS CREEK

They'd come from miles around to hear Neil Phillips—Professor of Earth Sciences at Melbourne University talk about the almost unique granite formations in our Strathbogie Ranges.

About 35 people attended the Creightons Creek Landcare Group's meeting to listen to the guest speaker and judging by the extended Q&A session they were not disappointed.

Professor Phillips identified the granite formations in our Strathbogie district as one of only three such global occurrences; the other two being the Cape of Good Hope in South Africa and one in Nova Scotia.

The crowd was entranced by the digital satellite images that clearly defined the local granite formations that, according to Prof. Phillips, were created as horizontal flows of magma at temperatures around 850degC. While the oldest rock formations in Victoria have been dated to 600 million years, we were told that the Strathbogie granite was probably only 370 million years old.

One of the defining features of the Strathbogies' granite is the abundant presence of Cordierite. This is the black flecking material that is common in our granite but which geologists in other parts of the world rarely encounter in a lifetime of study.
