# **BOTANY, BIRDS & CREATURES**

It's not often I get to introduce Peg Lade to a new bird for her list for Highlands, but I did so the other day. Square-tailed Kites can be found in wooded areas all over Australia but are quite rare - in Victoria the population estimate is from 20 to 50 pairs. I used to see what I was pretty sure was one around Caveat 20 years ago, but hadn't seen one for years until a few weeks ago when I saw a bird while I was driving and thought – it's that stupid thing that looks like a Square-tailed Kite but I was never actually certain was; I'm not going to waste time on it again.

But I did stop and was glad I did because it flew straight onto a nest where I was able to get a good enough look to confirm its identity. I've been keeping an eye on the nest for a few weeks now but I haven't seen signs of young yet.

It's a medium-size bird of prey, similar in size to a Little Eagle or Whistling Kite, with long thin wings with prominent fingering.

It soars with wings slightly upturned.
When perched its folded wings are
longer than its tail.

If you see a pale face you can be sure of the identification but often in flight this isn't obvious (which is why I was never 100% sure before).

It eats small birds and their eggs, lizards, frogs and insects, and hunts by flying low over treetops and pouncing into the canopy.

It's not a threat to any sort of livestock.
