THE SEARCH For THE PERCH

PROGRESSION OF THE HUGHES CREEK REPORT

A final draft of a much awaited report, prepared for the Goulburn Broken CMA by a consultant with a strong knowledge and history of the Hughes Creek and Macquarie Perch, is nearing completion with no further significant changes expected.

The report provides recommendations that will be used to help guide investment and effort in the Hughes Creek Catchment and to assist in the management of the resident Macquarie Perch population.

The historic channel change of the Hughes Creek, with consideration to sand slug development and movement is a key component of the report, along with investigation of the risks to the threatened Macquarie Perch population.

The report titled River Reaches, Historical Channel

Changes and Recommended Methods to Improve Macquarie Perch Habitat on Hughes Creek, Victoria details several recommendations to improve the habitat and potential range for Macquarie Perch.

The GBCMA will consider these recommendations and seek community support for implementation.

LOCAL GOINGS ON

RUFFY CFA WALKS the TALK

There was a good turn-out for the Ruffy Rural Fire Brigade's Community Fire Awareness Meeting at 6pm on Saturday 22nd November.



CFA Hume Region Community Officer, Robert Scott led the locals on a stroll from Noye Lane down Buntings Hill Rd. and engaged the crowd in discussions about roadside vegetation management for wild-fire mitigation

As always, there were a variety of views about how much roadside management is too much, but Robert constantly emphasised that Victorian state legislation

dictates that any roadside vegetation management must be conducted under permit and/or with oversight from the relevant authorities ie: Shire, CMA, DEPI, VicRoads etc.

Back at the Fire Shed, Robert delivered an informative presentation on landholder fire awareness, readiness and preparation.

The attendees were predominantly local CFA members who already have a better than basic understanding of these issues and it was a shame that more 'part-time' locals were not present given that Ruffy Fire Captain John Furlanetto had scheduled and timed the event to make it convenient for these folk to attend.

Community Information Session—Yarck Streetscape

Council will present to the Yarck community proposed plans for the redevelopment of the Streetscape at a public information session. The popular Yarck Village Hub will be rejuvenated with the implementation of streetscape improvements. Proposals include new pathways and improvements to signage, car parking, seating and landscaping that will greatly enhance connectivity, community access and public amenity. The information session will be held at the Yarck Fire Station on Thursday 4 December 2014 from 6pm – 7.30pm.

Honouring our Ruffy Hero



As reported in the Granite News of 7th
September, the historic tree guard and plaque
honouring local Victoria Cross recipient
Lt. Colonel Leslie Maygar, which was gifted to
the Ruffy community by Euroa RSL, has been
beautifully restored thanks to
Gary and Kerry Hewlett.

A Public Forum was convened on 21st September to decide where this memorial should be placed, and this was attended by twelve Ruffy residents. After discussion of a number of proposed sites for the memorial a motion "to place the memorial tree guard at a prominent location at the Maygar Reserve and to plant a suitable tree", proposed by E Sprunt and seconded by K Hewlett, was carried by 6 votes for and 5 votes against.

A group of volunteers has now installed the tree guard near the entrance to the Ruffy Recreation Reserve, and Kerry Hewlett has sourced a Lone Pine seedling from the Australian War Memorial in Canberra.

On **Sunday 14th December, 10.00 am**, a ceremony will be held at the Recreation Reserve, where John and Andy Wilson will be planting the Lone Pine seedling. Everyone is welcome to attend this event, which will be followed by morning tea.
