TERIP TERIP TENNIS TRENDING TOWARD TERRIFICNESS

The Terip Terip Tennis Courts have served the Tablelands Community for generations. Back in the day, local farmers used to knock off work on a Wednesday afternoon to play tennis. It had to be Wednesdays because most of them played cricket on weekends.

The tennis courts have been the mainstay of the Terip Recreation Reserve and the annual New Years Tournament which has been held annually for over 50 years has been a 'must do' for followers of the amateur country tennis circuit.

The playing surface of this vital piece of community infrastructure has steadily deteriorated over the years and the management committee has applied for funding grants 5 times in the past 10 years in order to remediate the playing surfaces.

In 2014, they finally hit pay dirt.

A State Government "2 for 1" grant was received to rebuild and upgrade the playing surfaces with Modgrass at a budgeted cost of \$98,000.



The very happy Terip Tennis Club Committee, Frances Lawrence, Helen McKenzie, Sue Martin, Cindy & Tim Hayes are looking forward to the completion and opening of the resurfaced Terip Tennis courts.

There are three courts, one being a multi-purpose court for tennis, handball and netball.

Works are nearing completion and the 2015 tournament has been held over to coincide with the Grand Opening on Saturday February 28th.

Tournament entries are invited & everyone is welcome at the Grand Opening.


