There are not many events like this around these days but the small determined committee work hard and the Ruffy Rec Reserve was a picture.





Recorder was one of the flashiest and versatile instruments of the 17th and 18th centuries as it was capable of playing impressively rapidly thus allowing for great showmanship. Its expressive capabili-

ties also enabled music of serious beauty to evolve.

Alana plays various sizes of recorder and makes this music come totally alive with Peter Hagen providing the dramatic accompaniment to this highly entertaining and gripping programme.
