### **BOTANY, BIRDS & CREATURES**

### Autumn is the Season for Spiders.

See if you can find a Golden Orb Silk Weaving Spider like this large female, who had built a strong wheel shaped web from sticky golden threads suspended between two shrubs.

Golden Orb Weaving Spiders are found in dry open forest, they prey on flies, beetles, grasshoppers, moths and cicadas.



Sometimes their strong webs manage to trap small birds or bats.

The spider will wrap them and feed upon them. It is common for a number of tiny (6mm) males to live around the edges of a female's web, waiting for a mating opportunity.

After mating, the Golden Orb Weaving Spider wraps her single egg sac in a mass of golden silk, which is hidden in foliage away from the web disguised within a curled leaf or sprig of twigs.


Orb weavers are reluctant to bite and their venom is not poisonous but I find the females frighteningly large and I try to avoid getting tangled in their stringy webs.

## It's All Happening At The "G"

When Ruffy started playing Highlands at Strath Creek all those years ago, who would have thought we'd end up playing at the MCG?
