The Cup Moth Cometh

Cup Moth larvae are eating new eucalyptus growth around Longwood and Euroa.

When I first found these interesting looking caterpillars I thought they looked very cute but on further research I found that they can become quite destructive.

They will skeletonise leaves creating an open canopy and a brown landscape rather than a blue/ green Eucalypt forest colour.

The caterpillars do not have legs, rather they move in a wave like motion.



The larva will grow up to 40mm and they can inflict painful stings.

The Cup Moth is often present and this year it is over abundant.

It's impact on native vegetation is not permanent although some individual trees may not recover.

The threat is temporary, the bush has

he threat is temporary, the bush has had a good season and is resilient to this Cup Moth invasion.

The larva (or caterpillar) will pupate by constructing a cocoon.

The moth emerges through a cap in the top. The cocoon is where the name "Cup Moth" comes from.

Andrew says "My illustrations have always been 'detailed and tight' so it has been a joy and challenge to work in acrylics and larger formats. It feels to me like the desert lends itself to larger canvases or the tight cropping of images to exaggerate the vastness of the landscape.

If you get caught up in the detail you almost destroy what you are trying to achieve: it's the flavour I'm trying to capture"

Lesley describes herself as "passionate about colour and I love to dabble with textures and shades.

I have interpreted the colours of the desert beginning with my woven paper cards which soon branched into framed variations of these ideas. I played with birdy mobiles, delving into my extensive bead collection. There are a couple of small crazy patchworks with some stitching which outlines the central shapes. I have also woven a few winter scarves in these same gorgeous colours, incorporating some textured yarns for a slightly wild effect."
