ROMANTIC COMEDY CONCLUDES FILM SOCIETY SEASON

Murrindindi Film Society's successful 2015 season concludes on Friday 18th September. Doors will open at the Yea Shire chambers at 6.45 for drinks and nibbles and at 7.00 p.m. the 1954 Swedish romantic classic **Smiles of a Summer Night** will screen in digital format.

Directed by acclaimed Swedish filmmaker Ingmar Bergman, this is a fine example of his lighter touch and was the first of his films to achieve international success.

The story, inspired by Shakespeare's A Midsummer Night's Dream, it is set in 1900 and involves three couples who meet in a country house on a summer night and, after much comic manoeuvring, eventually change partners. The film was the basis for Stephen Sondheim's theatrical musical A Little Night Music, which was also filmed in 1973.

The mood is gentle and the amorous incidents are portrayed tastefully and with elegance. The ensemble cast of great Swedish actors handle their roles delightfully and there is an exquisite musical score. A film greatly admired by critic David Stratton of "David and Margaret" fame, it remains a charming piece of entertainment.
