One Thousand Rabbits Gone!



The Sporting Shooters
Association of Australia's
Field Hunters Club has
been working around Longwood, Avenel, Ruffy, Gobur, Alexandra and Euroa in an area greater than 65,000 acres over the past two years on a Feral Animal Control Program. This program aims to reduce feral and pest animals for property owners at *no cost* and has now removed over 1000 rabbits and 80 foxes.

Field Hunters Club professional controllers have also now devoted in excess of 1000 man hours to help reduce and maintain feral and pest animals in an ongoing program that is now showing major results. The program offers assistance to Landcare groups, Conservation networks and Property owners in a structured, safe, professional and ethical environment, backed by a \$20 million insurance policy.

We can assist you with the removal and control of (Rabbits, Foxes, Feral Cats, Goats, Deer and Pigs) and assistance with obtaining and acting on (Authority To Control Wildlife Permits). Our process commences with the Project Co-ordinator meeting the property owners to discuss and identify feral animals that are a problem on their property. Maps are then created which clearly display the property boundaries and your outlined exclusion zones and once completed, the Project Leaders are introduced to the property owners or property manager and dates are set for the program that suits you.

From here we contact you before attending each time and the Program Co-ordinator and the Project Leads manage the correctly trained professional controllers to complete the required work, keeping in constant communication with the property owners or the property manager at all times.

At the completion of each project, the Project Leads complete a field report with dispatched numbers and this information is relayed back to the property owners for their records.



What is the RUFFY COMMUNITY ACTION GROUPand what does it do?

The Ruffy Community Action Group (RCAG) was created in 2009 to act as a local forum and as an effective intermediary between the local community and the Strathbogie Shire Council.

It consists of representatives of the various community groups and interests in the Ruffy area, and its quarterly meetings are open to all members of the community. RCAG receives regular funding through the Council's 'Community Action Group Funding' program and enjoys the advice and support of the Shire's Community Development Officer.

A round of community consultations in 2012 identified Ruffy's special community values and strengths, as well as its ambitions for the future. Based on these consultations RCAG developed the 'Ruffy Community Action Plan 2012' which is a guiding vision for RCAG.

- * a sustainable future for the Ruffy area, balancing compatible economic development with maintaining important environmental and social values
- * harmonious interaction and cooperation between old and new residents, different interest groups within the community and with the responsible authorities
- * a well-informed community that participates actively in matters that affect it.

Since its creation RCAG has been successful in assisting various community groups in funding & implementing their projects. Its achievements include the development of the Ruffy Streetscape Plan and creation & maintenance of the Ruffy Community Website www.ruffycommunity.com.au

In dealing with Council and developing projects for the Ruffy community, RCAG aims to be representative of broad community views. However, it can only be truly representative if community members take an active interest and participate in its meetings – unfortunately this has not been the case recently.

On this background I would like to invite old and new members of the Ruffy community to come to the next RCAG meeting, to find out what's going on and how to take an active part in community developments.
