HUGHES CREEK — A NATURAL WONDER RIGHT IN OUR OWN BACKYARD

Last Sunday 21 intrepid locals took up the invitation from HCCC Landcare's Janet Hagen to join her in a walk of discovery down the Hughes Creek from the Ruffy Boathole to Caveat.

Of course, generations of locals have explored every inch of this fabulous tributary and have taken advantage of it as a place to play, to fish and to interact with nature, but to the newcomer the Hughes Creek is a revelation.


At the top end around Ruffy it offers an example of how water has traditionally moved through the Australian landscape via chains of ponds with interruptive reed beds that filter & slow the water thus allowing it to permeate the adjacent sub-soils and to provide habitat for platypus and a myriad of other wildlife.



Further down at Caveat it picks up speed as it cascades across granite shelfs with the occasional waterfall. The creek then cuts its way into the gorges that are simply breathtaking. Mounds of huge granite rocks pile up on each bank as if they've been lowered into place by some giant crane, but they look like mere

yonnies when compared to the massive granite boulders that hang precariously on the steep banks of the gorge overlooking their cousins that eons ago succumbed to gravity and now lie in the creek bed with their awesome magnitude offering an almost spiritual experience to the visitor.





The walk took the best part of 4 hours, terminating at Michael Kopanica's property where most of the hikers refreshed themselves with a drink from the permanent mineral spring.

This inspiring walk is highly recommended but it would be a good idea to consult Janet Hagen before


