WHITEHEADS CREEK

Volunteers the key to improving the catchment's environment

More than 3000ha of weed control and more than 99,000ha of fox control were achieved by community natural resource management (NRM) groups in the Goulburn Broken catchment during 2014/15.

The catchment's 96 community NRM groups and 12 networks also achieved:

* 562.7ha of revegetation;
* 394.8ha of vegetation protection and improvement;

- * 1757ha of rabbit control;
- * 126.8km of fencing; and

* built 1145 nest boxes.

Goulburn Broken Catchment Management Authority (CMA) CEO Chris Norman said the work carried by the volunteer groups was critical for improving the region's land, water and biodiversity.

"The membership of these Landcare groups and networks, sustainable farming groups and conservation management networks are largely volunteer-based, which makes the delivery of these onground works even more impressive," Mr Norman said.
