Good weather & great company combined last Sunday to make this hike an enjoyable way to explore and appreciate the beautiful country side we are fortunate enough to live in.





2016 SPELLS THE END for HIGHLANDS SCHOOL

It is with sadness that we inform the community that the Highlands Primary School will be closing at the end of the 2016 school year.

Based on an expected low number of enrolments for 2017, it is a shared concern that our current students will not benefit socially in such a small group and that the functionality of the school would not be met with only a few families.

The future of the school has been discussed many times, in order to determine what is best for current students at the school, as well as what is best for the future of the school. Following this consultation and discussion, and while a difficult decision to make, it is a common belief that current enrolments mean the school is not a viable option moving forward.

We will continue to keep the community informed & involved from this point onwards but our main focus now is that the remainder of the 2016 school year runs as normally and most importantly as happily as possible for our current 13 students.

There will be plans made for a community event to celebrate and reflect and we will inform the community of this when the date and details are set. We trust that the last few months of this school year will be a celebration of our wonderful school and of the quality education that children have received at HPS for more than 100 years.
