### **The Ruinous Rabbit**

24 rabbits were released near Winchelsea Victoria in 1859 and quickly established themselves across Australia, increasing to an estimated 600 million by the 1990's.



There've been many control attempts with varying degrees of success, no one method has proven completely successful. In the early 1950's the myxomatosis virus killed almost 99.8% of the rabbit population, however within a few short years the rabbit population had increased again. The RHD or RCD virus was introduced in the mid 1990's with a 50% kill rate in arid areas, with a new strain of the virus to be released over the next 12 months.

Studies also indicate the myxomatosis infection rate has dropped to 40%, so disease cannot be relied upon alone, to control rabbit populations.

The HCCC offers a 50% rabbit ripping subsidy. There's no limit to the hours you can request, however if more than 8 hours your property will need to be inspected prior to work commencing.

To receive the subsidy, the HCCC facilitator will need to inspect your property before & after the excavator has ripped. The inspection can be organised by email and will take about an hour on site. Once the ripping has been approved it will be up to you to organise a contractor to carry out the approved work.

The Highlands School was burned to the ground in 1934 and all early records were lost.

Temporary quarters were used in a house about a ½ mile west. The present Highlands Hall, with schoolroom attached, was built and school resumed here, again on a part time basis with Molesworth Gap.
