An Intergenerational Thank You to Highlands Primary School—No 3440

When news broke that Highlands Primary School was closing there were widespread feelings of sadness and a sense of loss. Down the years we've seen this scenario so many times that you'd think we'd take it in our stride — just another example of our changing world. But this was different. This school has meant so many things to so many people and it is also the birthplace of The Granite News.

For 114 years Highlands Primary School has been a heart & soul place; not just a collection of buildings that housed hundreds of local kids during the daytime hours of their formative years, but a sanctuary and a portal through which those children learned to view the world.

It would have been understandable had last Sunday's school closure event been a sombre affair, but no; in the positive spirit that has always defined HPS, the organising team delivered a celebration, and well over 200 people turned out on a perfect day.

Present & past pupils, Principals, Teachers, Administrators, Bus Drivers, Chaplains, Mums & Dads; they were all there to reminisce and to recognise the priceless contribution that this wonderful little country school has made to our nation over 114 years.

Miranda Yorston was MC who led us through a potted history of the school and then introduced an entertaining range of speakers: Jim Davidson spoke of the sporting rivalry between Highlands & Ruffy schools where Highlands always won because they had three McCall kids who could always run faster, jump higher and kick longer; Peter Lebidka told us of the 3 generations of his family who have bussed the Highlands kids 2.8million kilometres over the past 56 years; past Principals each related heartfelt & humorous memories of their time at Highlands — John Gosstray talked about the warmth of the welcome he received from the Lade family upon his posting here;

Lorna McDonald spoke about the

generosity of the community in ensuring that every child had the opportunity to participate irrespective of their socio-economic background; Alison Mildren recounted the time she suggested to Miranda one morning that they light-up the burn pile before the children arrived, and how a rabbit ran out of the pile, on fire, just as the school bus pulled up, so Miranda dispatched the rabbit with a shotgun; Meagan Callander told of her attempt to find the 'tree-climbing' policy within the Dept of Education's Standard Operating Procedures and she noted the introduction of the Chaplaincy program and the creation of the Woolshed Dance as two of her most satisfying achievements; Maree Moyle has the distinction of being the final Principal at Highlands Primary School and she spoke passionately about the unique experience it has given her.

Everyone's spirits were high as we feasted on the Highlands Community Group's barbeque while celebrating over a century of local education history.
