CONVERSATIONS

STRATHBOGIE REPS RECEIVE RESIDENTS' RAPS......and remain unRuffled

A delegation of Strathbogie Shire Councillors came up the hill to Ruffy on their "Let's talk...we're Listening" tour on 28th February. The evening was hosted by Councillors Alistair Thomson, Kate Stothers, Deb Swan, John Mason, Malcolm Little and Mick Williams.





It must be a daunting prospect for any local Councillor to face their ratepayers 'en masse', because just about every Shire in every State faces demands and expectations well above their financial capacity; and the Ruffy community certainly turned out en masse.

42 local residents accepted the invitation to work through a comprehensive range of issues with their Strathbogie Shire representatives.

It's no surprise that the biggest concern was the appalling state of our local roads, but there was also temperate and mature discussion around many other issues such as: the lack of response by Shire personnel to residents' enquiries; inconsistent rate valuations; roadside weed control & protection of native vegetation; clearing of fallen roadside trees; inappropriate roadside signage; insurance cover for sports events on sports grounds; the CFA Captain excluded from Shire's fire planning; all Shire spending should be assessed for productivity that generates economic activity; and a potential review of the Rural Farm Zoning regulations.

What may have been interpreted as a 'divide & conquer' strategy by having each Councillor host a table of residents, was in fact an effective way of giving everybody the space and time to work one-on-one with their designated Shire Councillor.

Apart from the terrific supper served by the Ruffy Rec Reserve caterers, the highlight of the night was Councillor Mick Williams announcing his credentials as a road-maker then conceding that the Shire is using Mangalore gravel on our roads which is entirely unsuitable as a road topping.

A robust Q&A session concluded the evening, and Councillor Thomson summed up with a commitment to respond with feedback to the individuals and the community on the key issues.



After the meeting it was noted that some


LOCAL GOINGS ON
